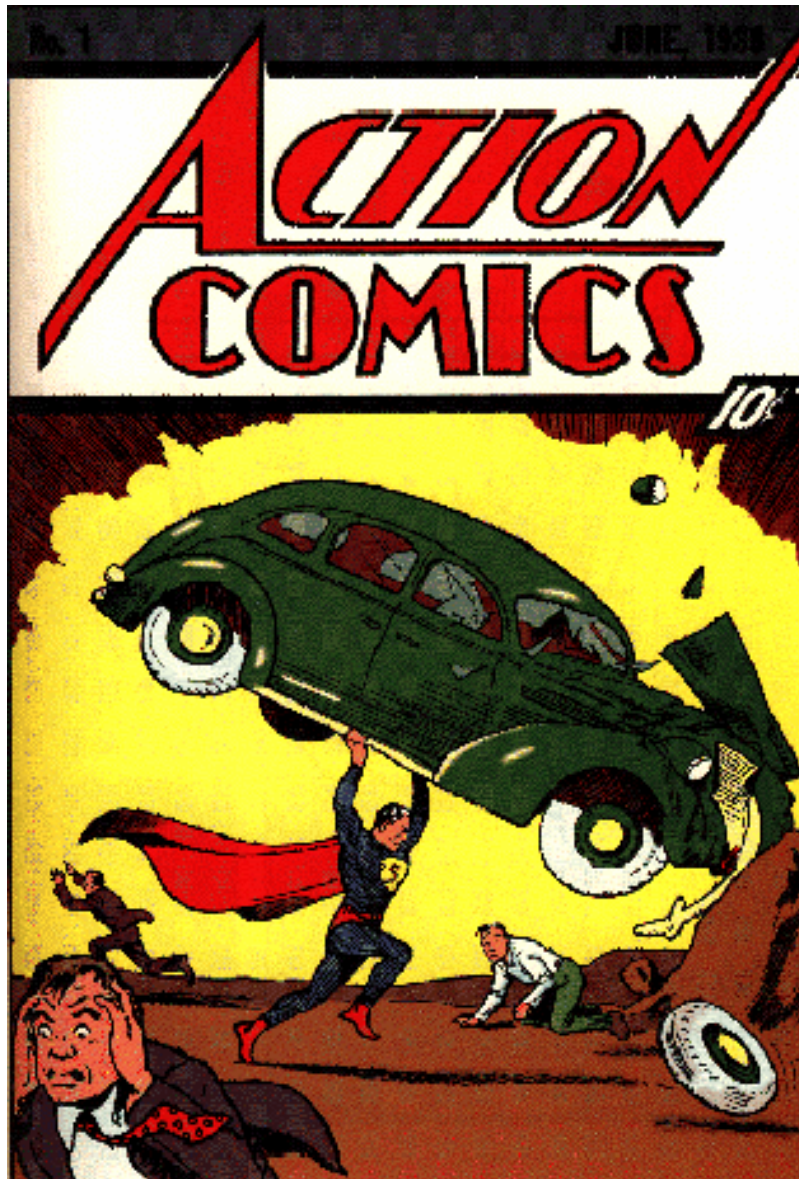

# DC Comics, A Retrospective

## Part One: The Platinum Age

The American “comic book” got its start over a century ago, in March 1897. The first ever ongoing newspaper cartoon, called **The Yellow Kid**, was collected together by Dillingham Company, reprinted in magazine form, and distributed on the newsstands. Over the next few decades, a handful of similar strip reprints were published, with little impact. In 1933, Harry I. Wildenberg and Max C. Gaines, employees of Eastern Color Printing Co., printed 10,000 copies of **Funnies On Parade**, 32 pages of Sunday newspaper reprints, published for Proctor & Gamble as giveaways. Gaines convinced Eastern Color that he could sell similar collections to other advertisers. Thus was born **Famous Funnies: A Carnival Of Comics** and **Century Of Comics**. They were produced in quantities of 100,000 to 250,000. By 1934, Gaines was certain that youngsters would pay \$0.10 for such comic magazines. Eastern Color ran off 35,000 copies of **Famous Funnies, Series 1**, which sold out promptly on the newsstands. In May, Eastern Color issued its first ongoing comic, **Famous Funnies #1** (dated July 1934). The stage was set.

In the Fall of 1934, Major Malcolm Wheeler-Nicholson, who had served in the U.S. Army from 1911 to 1924 and later became a writer for pulp magazines, saw what was going on and came up with an idea. Since reprint material was becoming more and more scarce, he would start a company and produce an original material comic book! After renting office space in Manhattan, he began recruiting artists and writers and sought out financing. He formed Nicholson Publication Co., Inc. and produced **New Fun Comics #1** (dated Feb 1935). **New Fun** began as a tabloid-sized magazine with a color cover and 32 black & white interior pages. Because of the Major’s shaky finances, he often didn’t get around to paying his artists what he promised, leading to much ill-will and a lot of staff changes. This led to contributions from a variety of creators eager for a job. One strip of note came from out of Cleveland, from two young men named Jerry Siegel and Joe Shuster. The strip, which they signed using the aliases Legar & Reuths, was called Doctor Occult and debuted in **New Fun Comics #6** (dated Oct 1935). Although intended as a monthly, issue #7 didn’t come out until three months later, under the new name **More Fun Comics**. The magazine began shrinking to what would soon become the standard comic book size. The Major kept adding color to the interiors, and the page count settled at 64 pages.

Undaunted by the lack of success of **New Fun**, the Major brought out a second magazine in 1935. The first issue of **New Comics** (dated Dec 1935) weighed in at 80 pages, but this title too was soon reduced to 64 pages. Like **New Fun**, this magazine offered adventure, comedy, and text features. With issue #12, the title was renamed **New Adventure Comics**. With issue #32, the title would be called **Adventure Comics**.

In early 1936, features from the first five issues of **New Fun** were gathered and reprinted in a 48 page one-shot called **Big Book Of Fun Comics #1** (Spring 1936).

The last title that the Major had a hand in, and the one whose initials would later give the line its name, **Detective Comics** (dated March 1937), hit the stands in early 1937. The book was originally slated to appear three months earlier in 1936, and was intended to be the first to be dedicated to a single theme, but it was delayed and was beat out by *Detective Picture Stories* by Comics Magazine Company. The first issue of **Detective Comics** featured such characters as Slam Bradley, Speed Saunders, and Cosmo the Phantom of Disguise.

At the end of 1937 and in the beginning of 1938, two more reprint books were produced. **New Book Of Comics #1** (dated 1937) was 96 pages and reproduced portions of **New Comics #1-4** and **More Fun #9**. The second issue (dated Spring 1938) was also 96 pages and reprinted parts of **More Fun #15-16**.

In the Spring of 1938, the Major's debts caught up with him and the Nicholson Publication Co., Inc. ceased to exist. Harry Donenfeld bought out the venture and, along with his accountant J. S. Liebowitz, launched Detective Comics, Inc.. Major Malcolm Wheeler-Nicholson returned to his former career of writing.

## DC Comics, A Retrospective Part Two: The Golden Age

In the Spring of 1938, Major Malcolm Wheeler-Nicholson's debts caught up with him and the Nicholson Publication Co., Inc. ceased to exist. Harry Donenfeld bought out the venture and, along with his accountant J. S. Liebowitz, launched Detective Comics, Inc..

Donenfeld and Liebowitz had little notion of the importance of their next title, a magazine originally planned by the Major to be called *Action Funnies*. Donenfeld contacted M. C. Gaines, who by now was working at the McClure Syndicate, looking for material for the first issue of his new magazine. Gaines had on his desk a very crude newspaper strip proposal called "Superman", a concept that Siegel and Shuster had conjured up in 1933 and had been desperately trying to sell for years. Their "Superman" was influenced by the mythic Hercules and Samson, the pulp heroes Doc Savage and the Shadow, and Philip Wylie's 1930 novel "Gladiator". Neither Gaines nor the McClure officials cared much for the feature. Only after being prodded by his assistant Sheldon Mayer, who saw great potential in the strip, did Gaines even suggest the strip to Donenfeld. The feature was sent to editor Vincent Sullivan. Superman was featured on the cover, and as the lead feature, of the first issue of **Action Comics** (dated June 1938). When Donenfeld saw the cover, with Superman holding a car over his head, he became worried that nobody would believe something so ridiculous. In fact, the next few covers didn't even show or mention Superman! The young readers were not as slow to catch on as the grown-ups at DC. They recognized Superman as something different, something special. With the introduction of Superman, the concept of the super-hero was born. That first issue also introduced Zatara the Magician, by Gardner Fox and Fred Guardineer, and Tex Thompson, who would later don a costume himself and become Mr. America.

**Detective Comics** #20 (dated Oct 1938) introduced the Crimson Avenger, a cloaked mystery man created by writer Jim Chambers in the image of the Green Hornet, a hero of radio since 1936. Just as the Green Hornet had his Kato, the Crimson Avenger had a young sidekick named Wing. The Crimson Avenger would later imitate the super-hero trend by trading in his overcoat for tights.

Late in 1938, M. C. Gaines entered into an agreement to produce a series of titles published under the DC umbrella. The initial titles, edited by Sheldon Mayer, were **Movie Comics** and **All-American Comics** (both appeared with a cover date of April 1939). While **All-American** featured some original material (including Mayer's Scribbly strip), much of the magazine was made up of newspaper reprints, and there were no super-heroes. Gaines told Mayer that he didn't think the public would be interested in any more costumed characters. Little did he know.

In early 1939, the first issue of **New York World's Fair Comics** (dated 1939) was published. This issue introduced the character called the Sandman, by Gardner Fox and Bert Christman. This would be Fox's first major strip, but hardly his last. (As much as some sources try to resist the facts, the Sandman appeared here before taking up residence in **Adventure Comics** with #40). This issue also featured Superman, Zatara, and others.

When editor Whitney Ellsworth called upon artist Bob Kane to create another hero for DC, Kane got right to work. His creation would combine aspects of such pulp heroes as the Shadow, Doc Savage, and the Spider, and would be greatly influenced by the exploits of the greatest of detectives, Sherlock Holmes. Kane based the image of his new character on the villain of the 1926 movie "The Bat", and would use actor Douglas Fairbanks Sr. as his inspiration. With writer Bill Finger, Kane introduced the next great super-hero, the Batman, in **Detective Comics** #27 (dated May 1939). Batman was dark and mysterious, a stark contrast to the colorful Superman, and was an immediate success. Interestingly enough, the Batman's origin would not be revealed for another six months.

The year 1939 also saw the introduction of the first quarterly to feature a single character. **Superman** (dated Summer 1939) started out compiling and reprinting the Superman feature from **Action Comics**, but by issue #4 the **Superman** magazine featured all new material.

By the time Gaines planned his next title, late in 1939, it was apparent that kids were more than willing to support super-heroes. Fox Publications had released *Wonderworld Comics*, *Mystery Men Comics*, and *Fantastic Comics*. Centaur Publications produced *Amazing Man Comics*. Timely Comics published *Marvel Mystery Comics*, soon called *Marvel Comics* (which the company would later adopt as its name). In response to the call for more super-heroes, Gaines created **Flash Comics** (dated Jan 1940), wherein he introduced two major players, the Flash and Hawkman. Edited by Sheldon Mayer, much of this new title was written by Gardner Fox. In fact, the only features Fox didn't have a hand in creating in that first issue were Johnny Thunder and the Whip. Flash was by Fox and Harry Lampert, and Hawkman by Fox and Dennis Neville. Johnny Thunder was by John Wentworth and Stan Aschmeier.



One DC competitor worth mentioning, Quality Comics, had made its first foray into the super-hero genre in 1939 with *Smash Comics* and *Feature Comics*. The Quality characters would later be purchased by DC after the company ceased publication in late 1956, continuing such titles as *Blackhawk* and *G. I. Combat* without interruption.. At the end of 1939, another competitor, Fawcett Publications, introduced a superhuman named Captain Marvel in *Whiz Comics*. DC would soon sue Fawcett for copyright infringement on their Superman property, a lawsuit that would stretch on for years. Ironically, DC would eventually buy the rights to Captain Marvel and the Marvel Family and, in late 1972, would proudly re-introduce the characters in the title called *Shazam!*.

A book called **Double Action Comics #2** (dated Jan 1940), possibly intended as a giveaway, was also produced in 1939. It was a 64 page, black & white one-shot, whose contents consisted of pre-hero reprint material and whose cover was identical to **Adventure #37**. Issue #1 was an ashcan that was never distributed.

**More Fun Comics #52** (dated Feb 1940) introduced the Spectre, a murdered police officer who was brought back as a ghost by a Divine Voice to fight evil. The story of the Spectre's origin would not conclude until the following issue, where the hero began his dual life as policeman and spectral avenger. The Spectre was written by Jerry Siegel and drawn by Bernard Baily.

**Adventure Comics #48** (dated Mar 1940) introduced the Hourman, by Bernard Baily, about a hero who depended on a pill for his temporary powers.

The dark knight called the Batman gained a colorful sidekick, Robin the Boy Wonder, in **Detective Comics #38** (dated Apr 1940). The idea was that young children could better identify with a character closer to their own age. Whether this was actually the case is debatable, but nevertheless DC started a trend that would be copied by many of its competitors. Bob Kane fashioned the child's costume after Robin Hood's, thus the character's name. Bill Finger saw Robin as Sherlock Holmes' Watson, someone the Batman could talk to, thus enabling the creators to reveal the hero's thoughts to the reader.

In early 1940, the second of DC's stars earned his own quarterly. The first issue of **Batman** (dated Spring 1940) introduced two of the Batman's greatest foes, the Joker and the Catwoman. The Joker became comics' first major villain. Artist Jerry Robinson insisted that the Joker was solely his creation. Bill Finger recalled showing Bob Kane a picture from the book "The Man Who Laughs", depicting actor Conrad Veidt's twisted, horrific grin, which would become the basis for the Joker's chilling look.

The second and final issue of **New York World's Fair Comics** (dated 1940) was published early in the year. It featured Superman, Batman & Robin, Hourman, Sandman, Zatara, and others.

**More Fun Comics #55** (dated May 1940) introduced Doctor Fate, by Gardner Fox and Howard Sherman, about a man who donned a golden helmet inhabited by the spirit of an ancient wizard.

Over in **All-American Comics**, Gaines succumbed to super-hero fever, and in issue #16 (dated July 1940) he introduced the Green Lantern. Draw by Martin Nodell, the Green Lantern was loosely based on the concept of Aladdin and his magic lamp. Bill Finger, who was chosen as the writer of this new feature, suggested Alan Ladd as a secret identity, a play on Aladdin. Sheldon Mayer thought that no one would believe it, and the name was changed to Alan Scott. (Contrary to some sources, actor Alan Ladd's first movie was not This Gun For Hire in 1942. Ladd appeared in many movies prior to that, including Pigskin Parade in 1936.)

One of Sheldon Mayer's more enduring creations was **All Star Comics** (dated Summer 1940). Begun as a quarterly, it brought together heroes from both the DC and All-American branches of the company. It would be another six months before the potential of this title would be fully realized.

**All-American Comics #19** (dated Oct 1940) introduced the pint-size powerhouse called the Atom.

In **All-American Comics #120** (dated Nov 1940), Scribbly's friend, Ma Hunkel, becomes the Red Tornado.

The third issue of **All Star Comics** (dated Winter 1940) introduced the first super-hero team, the Justice Society of America. The charter members of the JSA were the Flash, Hawkman, Sandman, Atom, Spectre, Dr. Fate, Green Lantern, and Hourman. This wonderful series was written by Gardner Fox.

**Action Comics #33** (dated Feb 1941) introduced Mr. America, formerly the civilian named Tex Thompson, who debuted in issue #1.

**World's Best Comics** (dated Spring 1941) hit the stands in early 1941, and was renamed **World's Finest Comics** with the second issue. This comic book enabled DC to feature its two most popular characters, Superman and Batman, in yet another of its magazines.

**All-American Comics #25** (dated Apr 1941) introduced Dr. Mid-Nite, about a doctor who is blinded, then discovers he can see clearly in the dark.

**Adventure Comics #61** (dated Apr 1941) introduced Starman, by Gardner Fox and Jack Burnley, about a scientist who invents a gravity rod which enables its wielder to fly.

**All-American Comics #26** (dated May 1941) introduced Sargon the Sorcerer, whose power was derived from his Ruby of Life.

Hawkman's girlfriend becomes Hawkgirl for the first time in **All Star Comics, #5** (June-July 1941).

Following a reader contest in **All Star Comics**, the Flash was chosen to be promoted to his own quarterly. The speedster resigned from the Justice Society to be featured in **All-Flash Quarterly** (dated Summer 1941).

**Adventure Comics #66** (dated Sep 1941) introduced the Shining Knight, initially drawn by Creig Flessel. This feature was a sort of reverse "Connecticut Yankee", wherein a knight from King Arthur's court awakens in the 20th century.

**More Fun Comics #71** (dated Sep 1941) introduced Johnny Quick, who simply had to speak the magic formula 3X2 (9YZ) 4A to become a super-speedster.

Another reader contest in **All Star Comics** led to a second hero gaining his own magazine. The Green Lantern also resigned his membership in the JSA and was featured in **Green Lantern** (dated Fall 1941).

DC's next entry into the market was **Star Spangled Comics #1** (dated Oct 1941), a magazine that was supposedly the result of careful research into what the readers wanted. They were so off the mark that, with the seventh issue, the title was overhauled. The first issue introduced the Star-Spangled Kid & Stripesy, who had been showcased in a three page promo in **Action Comics #40**. This feature by Jerry Siegel and Hal Sherman was unique in that the kid was the boss and the adult the sidekick! Also introduced in the first issue was the Tarantula. This creation of Mort Weisinger was a forerunner of Spider-Man, just as the pulp's Spider was a forerunner of the Tarantula.

**Action Comics #42** (dated Nov 1941) introduced the Vigilante, by Mort Weisinger and Mort Meskin, about a crimefighting prairie troubadour. The Vigilante was first assisted by old-timer Billy Gunn, then by Stuff the Chinatown Kid.

**More Fun Comics #73** (dated Nov 1941) introduced both Aquaman and Green Arrow. Aquaman, by Mort Weisinger and Paul Norris, was DC's answer to Timely Comics' Sub-Mariner. Green Arrow and Speedy was also by Weisinger, but drawn by George Papp.

The Sandman switched from cloak and gas-mask to skin tights, and took on a partner named Sandy the Golden Boy, in **Adventure Comics #69** (dated Dec 1941). This strip was initially drawn by Paul Norris. However, after a mere three issues, Joe Simon and Jack Kirby took the feature over.

The **All Star** format was so successful at All-American, that the formula was repeated for the DC line. **Leading Comics #1** (dated Winter 1941-42), introduced the company's second super-hero team, the Seven Soldiers of Victory. They consisted of the Star-Spangled Kid & Stripesy, the Shining Knight, the Vigilante, Green Arrow & Speedy, and the Crimson Avenger. The Crimson Avenger's sidekick, Wing, was considered an unofficial eighth member. The Justice Society they weren't.

**All Star Comics #8** (dated Dec 41-Jan 42) introduced the first truly powerful female hero, the Amazon princess called Wonder Woman. Embarrassingly enough, Wonder Woman, one of the strongest members of the Justice Society, was relegated to the role of secretary.

The final Gaines-Mayer monthly was **Sensation Comics** (dated Jan 1942), which starred Wonder Woman in the lead, fresh from her debut in **All Star Comics**. Wonder Woman was created by Dr. William Moulton Marston, who went under the pen name Charles Moulton, which was derived from his and Gaines middle names. Dr. Marston, a psychologist and the developer of the lie detector, wanted to create a feminine character with all the strength of Superman, plus all the allure of a good and beautiful woman. Artist Harry G. Peter brought Marston's character to life. Wildcat, by Bill Finger and Irwin Hasen, chronicled the exploits of a boxer turned hero. Mr. Terrific, by Charlie Reizenstein and Hal Sharp, was odd in that the story started out with the hero-to-be on the verge of suicide. Two other features of interest were the Gay Ghost and Little Boy Blue & the Blue Boys.

**Detective Comics #60** (dated Feb 1942) introduced Air Wave, about a character who had harnessed electrical energy and could skate on high tension wires. This strip, by Mort Weisinger and Lee Harris, also featured a different kind of sidekick, Static the parrot.

**World's Finest Comics #5** (dated Spring 1942) introduced an explosive crimefighting team called T.N.T. & Dan the Dyna-Mite, who then moved over to a regular feature in **Star Spangled Comics** starting with issue #7.

Joe Simon and Jack Kirby, lured over from Timely Comics, drew the cover to **Star Spangled Comics #7** (dated Apr 1942) and introduced the streetwise Newsboy Legion. These rowdy kids were mentored by the hero called, appropriately enough, the Guardian. Also introduced in this issue was Robotman, by Siegel and Shuster, about a murder victim whose brain was salvaged and placed into a robot body.

**Adventure Comics #73** (dated Apr 1942) introduced the Manhunter, another feature by Simon and Kirby. Initially, the Manhunter's secret identity was said to be Rick Nelson, but for some reason that name was soon changed to Paul Kirk. Curiously enough, a plainclothes manhunter named Paul Kirk had appeared in **Adventure** since issue #58. That original adventurer was created by Ed Moore, but apparently was not connected in any way to this new Paul Kirk.

**Detective Comics #64** (dated June 1942) introduced the Boy Commandos, another Simon and Kirby creation, about a group of tough kids who aided the Allies in its battle against the Nazis. They fought under the watchful eye of Captain Rip Carter.

After being introduced only a half-year earlier, Wonder Woman graduated to her own quarterly, **Wonder Woman** (dated Summer 1942).

**Boy Commandos #1** (dated Winter 1942-43) introduced Liberty Belle, a patriotic heroine created by Don Cameron and Chuck Winter.

The All-American group started a large economy book in late 1942 called **Comic Cavalcade** (dated Winter 1942-43), a 96 page, \$0.15 quarterly. This comic featured virtually all of the characters in the All-American stable.

A large one-shot sampler, **The Big All-American Comic Book** (dated 1944), was \$0.25 and 128 pages, and is memorable in that it was Joe Kubert's first Hawkman work. This issue also featured Wonder Woman, Flash, Green Lantern, the Atom, and others.

**More Fun Comics #101** (dated Jan-Feb 1945) introduced a feature, by writer Don Cameron, called Superboy, about the adventures of Superman when he was a boy. This was probably the first example of retroactive continuity in comics. In the seven years up until then, there was not even a hint that Superman had had any adventures prior to the events of **Action Comics #1**, and certainly none as a child! Superboy would graduate into his own magazine, **Superboy #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1949), four years later.

At the end of 1944, in part because of disputes with Jack Liebowitz, Gaines sold his interest in the company and departed to start EC Comics, leaving control of the All-American line to Liebowitz. (EC would soon become infamous for its horror magazines, like *Tales From The Crypt*, and would later go on to produce the satirical *Mad Magazine*, which survives to this day). The DC and AA lines were finally merged into a whole, renamed National Periodicals Publications, Inc.. Because of the familiarity of the DC logo to the reader, the books would continue its use on its covers. Sheldon Mayer would step down as editor in 1948 and return to his first love, cartooning.

Super-heroes weren't the only things that had come out of the DC and All-American stables. In 1939, Gaines had started a **Mutt & Jeff** magazine, utilizing the popular characters who had appeared in newspaper strips years prior to then. In 1942, Gaines had published **Picture Stories From The Bible**. **All Funny Comics** had come out in late 1943, featuring Genius Jones, Buzzy, and others. Gaines had published **Funny Stuff** in 1944, showcasing the Three Mouseketeers and the Terrific Whatzit. In late 1944, **Buzzy** was spun out of **All Funny**. Early 1945 saw the start of **Real Screen Funnies**, renamed **Real Screen Comics** with issue #2, which featured the Fox & Crow and Flippity & Flop. Also in 1945, Gaines, who at that time was in the process of starting up EC Comics, produced **Picture Stories From American History** with DC. (In 1947, Gaines would publish the last of his trilogy of "Picture Stories" titles, **Picture Stories From World History**, exclusively under his EC banner).

Following World War II, the interest in super-heroes waned. **Flash Comics** and **Green Lantern** were canceled in 1949. **All Star Comics** #57 (dated Feb-Mar 1951) was the last issue to star the Justice Society of America, changing format with the next issue to a western theme. Of the original golden age titles, only **Action Comics**, **Adventure Comics**, **Batman**, **Detective Comics**, **Superboy**, **Superman**, **Wonder Woman**, and **World's Finest Comics** continued chronicling the exploits of super-heroes. All other remaining titles switched to either western, romance, or funny animal features. It wasn't until 1956 that interest in super-heroes saw a resurgence, with a revamped version of the Flash in **Showcase** #4. But that's a story for another time.

## DC Comics, A Retrospective Part Three: The Plutonium Age

The end of the war led to many changes, including tastes in the comic book genre. While some titles continued unaffected (**Action Comics, Adventure Comics, Batman, Detective Comics, Superboy, Superman, Wonder Woman, World's Finest Comics, All Funny Comics, Buzzy, Funny Stuff, Mutt & Jeff, Real Screen Comics**), other titles would change format over the succeeding months (**All-American Comics, All Star Comics, Comic Cavalcade, Leading Comics, Sensation Comics, Star Spangled Comics**). Some titles were cancelled altogether (**All-Flash, Boy Commandos, More Fun Comics**).

The format changes began with **Leading Comics** #15 (Summer 1945), dumping the Seven Soldiers of Victory for funny animals. Although the war in Germany was over, we had not yet defeated Japan, yet the appeal of the super-hero was already lessening.

Early 1946 saw the release of three new, non-super titles, **Animal Antics** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1946), **Real Fact Comics** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1946) and **Funny Folks** #1 (dated Apr-May 1946).

**Real Fact Comics** #6 (dated Jan-Feb 1947) introduced Tommy Tomorrow, a science fiction strip designed by Jack Shiff and Mort Weisinger, set in the not-so-distant future.

Tomahawk, a frontier hero, was introduced in **Star Spangled Comics** #69 (dated June 1947), with art by Fred Ray.

In **Flash Comics** #86 (dated Aug 1947), Robert Kanigher and Carmine Infantino introduced the Black Canary in the Johnny Thunder strip.

**More Fun Comics** was cancelled with #127 (dated Nov-Dec 1947) and **All-Flash** with issue #32 (dated Dec 1947-Jan 1948).

The autumn of 1947 introduced **A Date With Judy** #1 (dated Oct-Nov 1947), a comic book based on a teenager's radio show. Late 1947 introduced other radio features to comic books, **Gang Busters** #1 (dated Dec 1947-Jan 1948) and **Mr. District Attorney** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1948).

**Western Comics** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1948), introduced the Wyoming Kid in late 1947. However, the western trend wasn't really evident until the Spring of 1948. **All-American Comics** #100 (dated Aug 1948) introduced a western hero named Johnny Thunder, vastly different from the character of the same name who had appeared in **Flash Comics** and **All Star Comics**. The adventures of this Johnny Thunder began with the team of Robert Kanigher and Alex Toth. **Western Comics** #5 (dated Sep-Oct 1948), introduced the masked gunman, Nighthawk. **Dale Evans Comics** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1948), a complement of sorts to the existing Roy Rogers Comic put out by Dell Publishing, also appeared at this time. Even **All-American Comics** got into the act, renamed **All-American Western** with issue #103 (dated Nov 1948).

Western comics weren't the only new trend though. More humor books began appearing, like **Leave It To Binky** #1 (dated Feb-Mar 1948) and **Scribbly** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1948), the boy cartoonist from **All-American Comics**. By late 1948, **Comic Cavalcade** #30 (Dec 1948-Jan 1949) changed it's format to funny animal stories.

At the close of 1948, one of M.C. Gaines' earliest superhero titles, **Flash Comics**, was cancelled, with #104 (dated Feb 1949). Another of his titles, **Green Lantern**, would soon be cancelled, with #38 (dated May-June 1949).

Going against the tides of change, Superboy actually gains a second book. In addition to his lead feature in **Adventure Comics**, he stars in his own magazine, **Superboy** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1949).

Attempts were also made to appeal to the young female audience, with such titles as **Miss Beverly Hills Of Hollywood** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1949), **Romance Trail** #1 (dated July-Aug 1949), **Girls' Love Stories** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1949), and **Secret Hearts** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1949). **Sensation Comics** was even renamed **Sensation Romance** with #94 (dated Nov-Dec 1949). Later titles included **Miss Melody Lane Of Broadway** #1 (dated Feb-Mar 1950) and **Girls' Romances** #1 (dated Feb-Mar 1950).

More real life characters were featured in comic book form, such as with **Jimmy Wakely** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1949), **The Adventures Of Alan Ladd** #1 (Oct-Nov 1949), and **The Adventures Of Ozzie And Harriet** #1 (Oct-Nov 1949).

More humor and film comics appeared in late 1949 and early 1950. Peter Porkchops graduated from **Leading Comics** with **Peter Porkchops** #1 (dated Nov-Dec 1949). **The Adventures Of Bob Hope** #1 (Feb-Mar 1950) started it's long run in the Fall of '49. The short-lived **Feature Films** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1950) started a month later. **Animal Antics** became **Movie Town Animal Antics** with #24 (dated Jan-Feb 1950), **Leading Comics** became **Leading Screen Comics** with #42 (dated Apr-May 1950), and **Funny Folks** becomes **Hollywood Funny Folks** with #27 (dated Aug-Sep 1950).



The adventure comic, however, was not yet lost amidst the waves of humor, romance, and film titles. **Danger Trail #1** (dated July-Aug 1950) featured the exploits of King Faraday, a secret agent. **Strange Adventures #1** (dated Aug-Sep 1950), introduced Kris KL-99 the Christopher Columbus of Space, by Edmond Hamilton, as well as Darwin Jones by David V. Reed. Tomahawk, the frontiersman, graduated to his own mag with **Tomahawk #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1950).

Late 1950 saw the start of the **Rudolph, The Red-Nosed Reindeer** comic, which would appear more or less annually for the next decade. **Big Town #1** (dated Jan 1951) also appeared at this time, based on the radio and television crime show.

Western comics were still going strong. **All Star Comics** became **All-Star Western** with issue #58 (dated Apr-May 1951), and introduced not one, but four new western stars: the Trigger Twins, Strong Bow, the Roving Ranger, and Don Caballero.

More science fiction titles began to appear. **Mystery In Space #1** (dated Apr-May 1951), introduced the futuristic Knights of the Galaxy, while **Strange Adventures #9** (dated June 1951), introduced John Broome's Captain Comet.

The Autumn of 1951 brought more humor comics, such as **Flippity & Flop #1** (dated Dec 1951-Jan 1952), **Fox And The Crow #1** (dated Dec 1951-Jan 1952), and **Here's Howie Comics #1** (dated Jan-Feb 1952). It also introduced some new mystery titles. **The House Of Mystery #1** (dated Dec 1951-Jan 1952) appeared, followed a month later by **Sensation Mystery #107** (dated Jan-Feb 1952), formerly **Sensation Romance**.

**The Adventures Of Rex The Wonder Dog #1** (Jan-Feb 1952) introduced two new animal stars. The first was Rex himself, the other was Bobo the Detective Chimp.

Only one new humor title, **The Adventures Of Dean Martin & Jerry Lewis #1** (July-Aug 1952), was added in 1952. The new wave of titles introduced that spring would instead turn their attention to a different type of book ... war comics. Specifically, the Second World War. **Our Army At War #1** (dated Aug 1952) began at that time. **Star Spangled Comics** became **Star Spangled War Stories** with issue #131 (dated Aug 1952). After issue #133, the numbering continued with issue #3. **All-American Western** became **All-American Men Of War** with issue #127 (dated Aug-Sep 1952). After issue #128, the numbering continued with issue #2.

**The Phantom Stranger #1** (dated Aug-Sep 1952), another mystery book, appeared on the shelves in the Spring of 1952.

There were very few new titles introduced in 1953. **Peter Panda** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1953) and **Everything Happens To Harvey** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1953) for the humor fans. **3-D Batman** #1 and **Three-Dimension Adventures (Superman 3-D)** #1 to satisfy the 3-D craze.

In late 1953, competitor Fawcett Publications, after a decade long copyright infringement battle with DC, decided to leave the comic book field. The last of the Captain Marvel books, **Marvel Family**, was cancelled with #89 (dated Jan 1954). **Hopalong Cassidy** was bought from Fawcett and began under the DC banner with #86 (dated Feb 1954).

The chronicles of the Superman-Batman team began in **World's Finest Comics** #71 (dated July-Aug 1954).

In the summer of 1954, **Mystery In Space** #21 (dated Aug-Sep 1954) introduced the Space Cabby, by Otto Binder and Gil Kane, while the adventurer Congo Bill graduated into his own magazine with **Congo Bill** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1954).

A number of title changes were made in the Summer of '54. **Movie Town Animal Antics** became **Raccoon Kids** with #52 (dated Sep-Oct 1954), **Hollywood Funny Folks** became **Nutsy Squirrel** with #61 (dated Sep-Oct 1954), and **Funny Stuff** became **The Dodo & The Frog** with #80 (dated Sep-Oct 1954).

The Superman family of titles was expanded in 1954 with **Superman's Pal, Jimmy Olsen** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1954).

1954 also saw the addition of one new war title, **Our Fighting Forces** #1 (dated Oct-Nov 1954), and one new adventure magazine, **My Greatest Adventure** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1955).

Animal sidekicks were in vogue in 1955. Krypto the Super-Dog, the sometimes pet of Superboy, was introduced in **Adventure Comics** #210 (dated Mar 1955). Ace the Bathound was introduced into the Batman mythos in **Batman** #92 (dated June 1955).

**The Brave And The Bold** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1955), created and edited by Robert Kanigher, was devoted to adventure heroes from past eras. The first issue introduced the Viking Prince, the Silent Knight, and the Golden Gladiator. The Viking Prince, a sword-wielding Scandinavian who crusaded alongside the Norse Vikings, was presented by Robert Kanigher and Joe Kubert. The Silent Knight, a masked hero active in 6th century England, was drawn by Irv Novick. The Golden Gladiator, the greatest warrior in all of ancient Rome, was drawn by Russ Heath.

A variety of titles were introduced in the Summer of '55. **Falling In Love #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1955), **It's Gametime #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1955), **Frontier Fighters #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1955) with Davy Crockett, Buffalo Bill, and Kit Carson, and finally **The Legends Of Daniel Boone #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1955).

Without much fanfare or expectation, a new character was introduced by Mort Weisinger and Joe Certa as a backup feature in **Detective Comics #225** (dated Nov 1955). J'onn J'onzz, the Martian Manhunter, was his name. While some argue that the appearance of the Martian Manhunter marks the beginning of the Silver Age, most still agree that the honor of "First Silver Age Hero" goes to a character who would not appear for another year.

Two more titles would be introduced by year's end, **Tales Of The Unexpected #1** (dated Feb-Mar 1956) and **The Three Mouseketeers #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1956).

A new title appeared at the dawn of 1956 which would soon change the course of comic book history. This magazine would feature stories whose themes were supposedly requested by the reader. **Showcase #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1956), featured Fire Fighters, the adventures of Fireman Farrell, by editor Jack Schiff and artist John Prentice. Hardly a concept worth showcasing.

**Sugar & Spike #1** (dated Apr-May 1956) began publication in early '56. In that same month, in **The Brave And The Bold #5** (dated Apr-May 1956), the legendary adventures of Robin Hood would begin.

**Showcase #2** (dated May-June 1956), featured Kings of the Wild by Bob Kanigher, with Joe Kubert, Ross Andru, and Russ Heath. This second issue, which centered around animal stories, was not much better than the first.

**Jackie Gleason And The Honeymooners #1** (dated June-July 1956), based on the television show of the same name, began in the Spring of 1956.

Batwoman, a garishly colored ally of Batman and Robin, was introduced in **Detective Comics #233** (dated July 1956).

**Showcase #3** (dated July-Aug 1956), featured Frogmen, by Kanigher and Heath. Like the previous two issues, this issue really didn't click with the reader. The magazine's true potential was not yet realized. In two short months, all that would change.

## DC Comics, A Retrospective Part Four: The Silver Age

At the dawn of the Silver Age, National was publishing a wide variety of titles. By this time, the superhero titles made up only a small portion of the company's output. Only those magazines featuring Superman, Batman, Wonder Woman, Aquaman, and Green Arrow (**Action Comics, Adventure Comics, Batman, Detective Comics, Superboy, Superman, Wonder Woman, World's Finest Comics, and Superman's Pal Jimmy Olsen**) existed just prior to the coming superhero revival. The bulk of the titles were of other genres. There were the war titles (**All-American Men Of War, Star Spangled War Stories, Our Army At War, Our Fighting Forces**), the western and frontier titles (**All Star Western, Hopalong Cassidy, Western Comics, Frontier Fighters, The Legends Of Daniel Boone, Tomahawk**), the adventure and science fiction titles (**The Brave And The Bold, Showcase, The Adventures Of Rex The Wonder Dog, Big Town, Buzzy, House Of Mystery, House Of Secrets, Gangbusters, Mr. District Attorney, My Greatest Adventure, Mystery In Space, Strange Adventures, Tales Of The Unexpected**), the humor titles (**The Adventures Of Bob Hope, The Adventures Of Dean Martin & Jerry Lewis, The Dodo & The Frog, Flippity & Flop, Fox And The Crow, It's Gametime, Jackie Gleason And The Honeymooners, Leave It To Binky, Mutt & Jeff, Nutsy Squirrel, Peter Panda, Peter Porkchops, The Raccoon Kids, Real Screen Comics, Rudolph The Red-Nosed Reindeer** annuals, **Sugar & Spike, The Three Mouseketeers**), and the romance titles (**A Date With Judy, Girls' Love Stories, Girls' Romances, Secret Hearts, Falling In Love**). All this was about to change.

Back in the forties and fifties, the idea of a long term readership wasn't even considered. The belief was that comic books were for small children who would outgrow the hobby by their late teen years. Thus, even though a super-speedster called the Flash existed a mere eight years earlier, nothing was thought of revamping the concept and introducing a brand new Flash to the reading public. The new Flash was introduced in **Showcase #4** (dated Sep-Oct 1956) by Bob Kanigher and Carmine Infantino. Because newsstand sales figures took some time to collect, the publisher would not learn of the impact that this new feature had on the latest wave of young readers.

The origin of Batman was retold in **Detective Comics #235** (dated Sep 1956), establishing for the first time that mobster Lew Moxon had hired Joe Chill to kill the parents of Bruce Wayne. Because there was no break in the publishing history of Batman and Robin, the dividing line between the adventures of the golden age and silver age Batman are fuzzy. Because it is an origin issue, some consider this to be the official starting point for the second Batman's chronicles.

Not yet aware of the popularity of the Flash revival, the showcase magazine returned to ordinary tales of law enforcement. **Showcase** #5 (dated Nov-Dec 1956) featured Manhunters by Editor Jack Schiff with artists Mort Meskin, Curt Swan, and Bill Ely.

**The House Of Secrets** #1 (dated Nov-Dec 1956), another mystery title, was added to National's publishing roster in late Summer of '56.

National continued publication of a trio of books, purchased from Quality Comics, one of many companies who had by this time decided to quit the comic book field. **Blackhawk** #108 (dated Jan 1957), **G. I. Combat** #44 (dated Jan 1957), and **Robin Hood Tales** #7 (dated Jan-Feb 1957) were all taken over in the Fall of 1956. National would pick up another Quality Comics series, **Heart Throbs** #47 (dated Apr-May 1957), three months later.

The Challengers of the Unknown, the first team of heroes in the Silver Age, were introduced in **Showcase** #6 (dated Jan-Feb 1957) by Dave Wood and Jack Kirby. Kirby had been responsible for the creation or co-creation of many of the comic book characters of the golden age, not just at National, but at many of her competitors. Within a few years, Kirby would return to Atlas Comics, the company formerly known as Timely Comics. A few years after that, after yet another company name change to Marvel Comics, artist Jack Kirby and writer Stan Lee would help cement the superhero as the focal point of the comic book industry.

Television's favorite comedic soldier, Sgt. Bilko, gained his own magazine, **Sergeant Bilko** #1 (dated May-June 1957), in the Winter of 1957.

Lois Lane, Superman's girl friend, was featured in **Showcase** #9 (dated July-Aug 1957) and, less than a year later, would become the first character in the showcase title to graduate to her own ongoing series.

**The Adventures Of Dean Martin & Jerry Lewis** became **The Adventures Of Jerry Lewis** with issue #41 (dated Nov 1957), dropping the straight man after the duo went their separate ways.

By the end of 1957, the sales figures on the two Lois Lane issues of **Showcase** were tabulated and Lois was deemed popular enough to carry her own series, **Superman's Girl Friend, Lois Lane** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1958).

In the Winter of '58, a trio of throwaway characters from the far future, called the Legion of Super-Heroes, were introduced in the Superboy feature in **Adventure Comics** #247 (dated Apr 1958). In the coming years, the cast of the Legion would grow, and the team would become a mainstay of the Superboy mythos, with Superboy himself becoming a member. Their first appearance was written by Otto Binder and drawn by Al Plastino.

That same Winter, after having appeared in four non-consecutive issues of **Showcase**, the Challengers of the Unknown became the second feature to graduate to their own series, **Challengers Of The Unknown** #1 (dated Apr-May 1958).

The Spring brought two more television shows into the comic book medium, **The New Adventures Of Charlie Chan** #1 (dated May-June 1958) and **Sgt. Bilko's Pvt. Doberman** #1 (dated June-July 1958).

The Superman mythos was greatly expanded upon in the Spring of 1958 with the introduction of the bottled-city of Kandor, a miniaturized city containing millions of Kryptonian survivors, in **Action Comics** #242 (dated July 1958).

The Space Ranger, a 22nd century lawman, was introduced in **Showcase** #15 (dated July-Aug 1958) by Arnold Drake and Bob Brown. After two issues in **Showcase**, the Space Ranger gained a feature in **Tales Of The Unexpected**.

Jimmy Olsen became the hero called Elastic Lad for the first time in **Superman's Pal, Jimmy Olsen** #31 (dated Sep 1958). He would appear in that identity from time to time, and would eventually become an honorary member of the Legion of Super-Heroes.

Adam Strange, champion of Rann, was introduced in **Showcase** #17 (dated Nov-Dec 1958), in a feature called Adventures On Other Worlds, by Gardner Fox and Mike Sekowsky. After three issues in **Showcase**, Adam Strange went on to star in **Mystery In Space**.

A new origin was given to Green Arrow in **Adventure Comics** #256 (dated Jan 1959). Like Batman, Superman, Wonder Woman, and Aquaman, the adventures of Green Arrow and Speedy had continued from the golden age into the silver age without interruption. The new origin presented here was so different from the original, with no mention being made of Speedy in the tale, that this is certainly a good choice for the beginning of the adventures of the second Green Arrow.

After four issues, and two and a half years, the Flash finally graduated from **Showcase** to his own magazine, **Flash** #105 (dated Feb-Mar 1959), picking up on the numbering of his predecessor's book.

A few new war heroes were introduced in the Winter of 1959. Gunner & Sarge were first appeared in **All-American Men Of War** #67 (dated Mar 1959), while Sgt. Rock was introduced in **Our Army At War** #81 (dated Apr 1959). Although Sgt. Rock was created by writer Bob Haney, the character didn't really reach his full potential until the team of Robert Kanigher and Joe Kubert took over the strip.

The origin of Wonder Woman was updated in **Wonder Woman** #105 (dated Apr 1959), adding to the legend the fact that the infant Diana received her awesome powers as a gift from the gods and goddesses as she lay in her cradle, instead of through rigorous Amazon training. Wonder Woman was one of those few heroes whose adventures continued uninterrupted from the golden to the silver age. This issue can be considered the starting point for the adventures of the second Wonder Woman.

Superman was in for the surprise of his life when, in the Winter of 1959, his teen-aged cousin, yet another survivor from Krypton, arrived on Earth. Supergirl, as she was dubbed, was introduced in **Action Comics** #252 (dated May 1959), by Otto Binder and Al Plastino.

Bat-Mite, a silly imp from another dimension, was introduced into the lives of Batman and Robin in **Detective Comics** #267 (dated May 1959).

Aquaman's origin was updated in **Adventure Comics** #260 (dated May 1959). Like a handful of other heroes, Aquaman had appeared without pause from the golden age into the silver age. This issue can certainly be considered the beginning of the adventures of the second Aquaman.

Lori Lemaris, a mermaid from Atlantis and former college girlfriend of Clark Kent, is introduced in **Superman** #129 (dated May 1959).

A new feature by Gardner Fox, The Space Museum, began in **Strange Adventures** #104 (dated May 1959).

Rip Hunter, Time Master was introduced in **Showcase** #20 (dated May-June 1959) by Ruben Moriera and Mike Sekowsky.

A new origin was finally given to Green Arrow's partner, Speedy, in **Adventure Comics** #262 (dated July 1959), six month's after his mentor's own origin was revamped.

**Real Screen Comics** became **TV Screen Cartoons** with issue #129 (dated July-Aug 1959).

Mark Merlin was introduced in **House Of Secrets** #23 (dated Aug 1959).

French freedom fighter, Mlle. Marie, was introduced in **Star Spangled War Stories** #84 (dated Aug 1959), created by Robert Kanigher.

After four years of high adventure, it had become apparent that super-heroes were the wave of the future, and **The Brave And The Bold** was turned into a try-out book. The Suicide Squad, a Kanigher creation illustrated by Ross Andru and Mike Esposito, was introduced in **The Brave And The Bold** #25 (dated Aug-Sep 1959).

The revamp of the Flash was so successful, the decision was made to update another of the golden age heroes. The new Green Lantern was introduced in **Showcase** #22 (dated Sep-Oct 1959), by John Broome and Gil Kane. Unlike the original, whose source of power was a magic lantern, the new Green Lantern's origins were rooted in science fiction, with him being but one of thousands of an intergalactic police corps.

Another television star received his own comic book in the Summer of '59 with **Pat Boone** #1 (Sep-Oct 1959).

Beppo the Super-Monkey, another surviving animal from the planet Krypton, was introduced in **Superboy** #76 (dated Oct 1959).

By the end of 1959, nearly every superhero had a teen sidekick. Thus, the Flash gained himself a partner, dubbed Kid Flash, in **Flash** #110 (dated Dec 1959-Jan 1960), while Aquaman took the orphaned Aqualad under his wing in **Adventure Comics** #269 (dated Feb 1960).

The origin of Robin was recapped in **Batman** #129 (dated Feb 1960), however a detailed revamp of his origin wouldn't surface for another nine years.

Supergirl gained a super-pet named Streaky the Super-Cat, an Earth-born animal who would gain temporary powers whenever it was exposed to a kryptonite derivative, in **Action Comics** #261 (dated Feb 1960).

Late in 1959, editor Julius Schwartz called upon writer Gardner Fox and penciler Mike Sekowsky to revamp the concept of the Justice Society, a team book which gathered all the publisher's powerhouses under one cover. **The Brave And The Bold** #28 (dated Feb-Mar 1960) introduced the Justice League of America, a team consisting of Superman, Batman, Wonder Woman, Aquaman, Flash, Green Lantern, the Martian Manhunter, and mascot "Snapper" Carr.

The Elongated Man, a character mistaken at first by the Flash to be a criminal, was introduced in **Flash** #112 (dated Apr-May 1960).



In the Winter of 1960, another television comedy was adapted into comic book form with the introduction of **The Many Loves Of Dobie Gillis #1** (May-June 1960).

The post-atomic war saga of the Atomic Knights, set in the distant year of 1986, was begun in **Strange Adventures #117** (dated June 1960) by John Broome. The crew would appear regularly, every third issue, for the next three and a half years.

After three try-out issues in **Showcase**, the second Green Lantern graduated to his own series, **Green Lantern #1** (dated July-Aug 1960), which also introduced the Guardians of the Universe to the Green Lantern mythos.

The Sea Devils, a team of scuba-diving adventurers, were introduced in **Showcase #27** (dated July-Aug 1960) by Bob Kanigher and Russ Heath.

Cave Carson was introduced in **The Brave And The Bold #31** (dated Aug-Sep 1960) in a feature called Inside Earth, about a group of professional underground explorers. He and his crew would appear sporadically in five issues off this title and three issues of **Showcase**.

The first ever 80-Page Giant Annual was introduced in the Summer of 1960, with the publication of **Superman Annual #1** (dated Oct 1960). At a time when back issues were hard to come by, this large square-bound book of reprints gave the younger readers a chance to read a number of classic Superman tales.

After three issues of **The Brave And The Bold**, the Justice League of America graduated to their own series, **Justice League Of America #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1960), by Gardner Fox and Mike Sekowsky.

Another war hero, Johnny Cloud, was introduced in **All-American Men Of War #82** (dated Nov-Dec 1960).

The origin of Aquaman was retold in **Showcase #30** (dated Jan-Feb 1961), with editor Jack Schiff and art by Ramona Fradon.

Editor Julius Schwartz decided it was again time to update another one of the golden age greats. The new Hawkman and Hawkgirl, by Gardner Fox and Joe Kubert, were introduced in **The Brave And The Bold #34** (dated Feb-Mar 1961). This time around, instead of being reincarnations of ancient Egyptian royalty, the characters were policeman from Thanagar, a planet orbiting the star Polaris.

Super-Chief, called Saganowahna by his fellow Iroquois Indians, was introduced in **All-Star Western #117** (dated Feb-Mar 1961). Sadly, the title was cancelled two issues later.

The Elongated Man married his girlfriend, Sue Dearborn, in **Flash** #119 (dated Mar 1961).

After four non-consecutive issues of **Showcase**, Rip Hunter and his crew of time-travelers graduated to their own series with **Rip Hunter . . . Time Master** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1961).

Bat-Girl, the niece of Batwoman, was introduced in **Batman** #139 (dated Apr 1961).

The Haunted Tank crew were introduced in **G. I. Combat** #87 (dated Apr-May 1961).

Mon-El was introduced into the Superboy mythos in **Superboy** #89 (dated June 1961), by Bernstein and Papp. At first believed by Superboy to be his older brother, this poor teenaged explorer from Daxam would be condemned to spend a millennia as a phantom, before being freed from his immaterial prison by the Legion of Super-Heroes.

Following the success of the 80-page Superman Annual, **Batman Annual** #1 (dated Aug-Oct 1961) and **Secret Origins** #1 (dated Aug-Oct 1961), both 80-page reprints themselves, were released.

By 1961, younger readers had begun asking questions about the golden age heroes, so an idea was hatched to bring those heroes back into the public eye. The original Flash returned in **Flash** #123 (dated Sep 1961), in a story by Gardner Fox and Carmine Infantino, which established the parallel worlds concept as a part of the fabric of the DC Universe. Oddly enough, the golden age Earth was dubbed Earth-Two, while the later silver age Earth was called Earth-One.

The origin of the Blackhawks was retold in **Blackhawk** #164 (dated Sep 1961). This was the first time their origin was presented in either the silver age or since National took over the series from Quality Comics.

The new Atom was introduced in **Showcase** #34 (dated Sep-Oct 1961) by Gardner Fox and Gil Kane. Unlike his predecessor, this version could actually shrink to subatomic size.

Dane Dorrance and his Sea Devils graduated to their own series, **Sea Devils** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1961), after three issues of **Showcase**.

Although the Justice League Of America had been introduced a full two years earlier, the creators, Gardner Fox and Mike Sekowsky, did not get around to revealing their origin story until **Justice League Of America** #9 (dated Feb 1962).

After four consecutive issues of **Showcase**, Aquaman graduated to his own series with **Aquaman** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1962).

Another super-animal was introduced into the Superman mythos in the Autumn of 1961. Comet the Super-Horse, a cursed centaur from ancient Greece who was transformed into a full-bodied horse with super-powers, was introduced in **Adventure Comics** #293 (dated Feb 1962). It is interesting to note however that this first appearance preceded his formal introduction by seven months. His first appearance was in a Legion of Super-Heroes story which explained that Supergirl would meet this super-steed sometime in the near future. The two finally met in **Action Comics** #292 (Sep 1962).

The Metal Men, a group of sentient robots created by Doctor Will Magnus, were introduced in **Showcase** #37 (dated Mar-Apr 1962) by Bob Kanigher and Ross Andru.

After three consecutive appearances in **Showcase**, the second Atom graduated to his own series, **Atom** #1 (dated June-July 1962).

Superman's girl friend, Lois Lane, received the next 80-page giant reprint with the publication of **Lois Lane Annual** #1 (dated Summer 1962).

By the middle of 1962, the Legion of Super-Heroes had appeared a dozen and a half times in the various Superman family of magazines. During that four year period, they had developed a following, and it was decided that the Legion was deserving of their own feature. The Legion of Super-Heroes began its first ongoing series, by Jerry Siegel and John Forte, with **Adventure Comics** #300 (dated Sep 1962), sharing the title with its long time lead, Superboy.

Superman and Jimmy Olsen became Nightwing and Flamebird, the Dynamic Duo of Kandor, for the first time in **Superman** #158 (Jan 1963), by Edmond Hamilton and Curt Swan.

Kid Flash, who up until this time wore a costume identical to his mentor's, received a new, unique costume in **Flash** #135 (dated Mar 1963).

Doc Magnus' Metal Men graduated from **Showcase** to their own series, **Metal Men** #1 (dated Apr-May 1963), after four consecutive issues.

After an adventure with the Flashes of two worlds, the legendary Justice Society of America, who were last seen as a team in late 1950, decide to come out of retirement. These events took place in **Flash** #137 (dated June 1963).

A team of freaks joined together in the Spring of 1963 to form the Doom Patrol in **My Greatest Adventure** #80 (dated June 1963), in a tale by Bob Haney, Arnold Drake, and Bruno Premiani. The team consisted of a small group of outcasts who were gathered together by a wheelchair-bound scientist. Three months later, Marvel Comics would introduce their *X-Men* title, about a group of outcasts who were gathered together by a wheelchair-bound professor.

The good-natured Dr. Bruce Gordon was transformed into the evil Eclipso for the first time in **House Of Secrets** #61 (dated July-Aug 1963), by Bob Haney and Lee Elias.

The Spring of 1963 saw the start of a comic book tradition. The first annual Justice League-Justice Society crossover took place in **Justice League Of America** #21-#22 (dated Aug and Sep 1963), by Gardner Fox and Mike Sekowsky.

National Periodicals continued publication of Prize Comics' **Young Romance Comics** #125 (dated Aug-Sep 1963) and **Young Love** #39 (dated Sep-Oct 1963) after that company left the comic book field.

Mera, a queen from an other-dimensional water-world, was introduced into Aquaman's life in **Aquaman** #11 (dated Sep-Oct 1963).

The evil Professor Zoom, also called the Reverse-Flash, was introduced in **Flash** #139 (dated Sep 1963). The Flash also got his own 80-page reprint at this time, **Flash Annual** #1 (dated Oct-Dec 1963).

Sgt. Rock was granted an 80-page reprint one-shot, **Sgt. Rock's Prize Battle Tales** #1 (dated Winter 1964).

Nine months and a half-dozen issues after the introduction of the Doom Patrol, the title of **My Greatest Adventure** was changed, with #86 (dated Mar 1964), to **The Doom Patrol**.

After two runs of three issues a piece in **The Brave And The Bold**, the new Hawkman and Hawkgirl graduated to their own series, **Hawkman** #1 (dated Apr-May 1964).

In the Winter of 1964, Batman's costume was changed, adding a yellow oval to his bat insignia. This subtle but distinctive alteration, which occurred in **Detective Comics** #327 (dated May 1964), was dubbed the "new look" Batman.

Captain Storm, a naval war hero, was introduced in **Captain Storm** #1 (dated May-June 1964).

The Blackhawks discarded their blue-black aerial outfits in favor of red and black outfits in **Blackhawk** #197 (dated June 1964).

In mid-1963, **The Brave And The Bold** had been turned into a team-up book. In 1964, a group of teen sidekicks, who would later call themselves the Teen Titans, were introduced in **The Brave And The Bold** #54 (dated June-July 1964). This teaming of Robin, Kid Flash, and Aqualad, was courtesy of writer Bob Haney.

The origin of the Blackhawks was retold once again in **Blackhawk** #198 (dated July 1964).

In the Summer of 1964, Superboy was featured in an 80-page reprint one-shot, **Superboy Annual** #1 (dated Summer 1964). At around that same time, an ongoing reprint title called **80-Page Giant Magazine** (dated Aug 1964) began.

The second Justice League-Justice Society crossover, which introduced Earth-Three, took place in **Justice League Of America** #29-#30 (dated Aug and Sep 1964), in a tale crafted by Gardner Fox and Mike Sekowsky. On Earth-Three, the super-powered parallels of the Justice League, called the Crime Syndicate of America, plagued that world instead of protecting it.

Zatanna the magician was introduced in **Hawkman** #4 (dated Oct-Nov 1964), searching for her father, Zatarra. Zatarra was one of the characters introduced alongside Superman in **Action Comics** #1.

Aquaman and Mera were married in a royal Atlantean ceremony in **Aquaman** #18 (dated Nov-Dec 1964).

Metamorpho the Element Man, by Bob Haney and Ramona Fradon, was introduced in **The Brave And The Bold** #57 (dated Dec 1964-Jan 1965).

Enemy Ace, a WWI German fighter pilot, was introduced in **Our Army At War** #151 (dated Feb 1965), created by Robert Kanigher and Joe Kubert.

The Teen Titans, which included a new heroine called Wonder Girl, were introduced in **The Brave And The Bold** #60 (dated June-July 1965). It must have been more than a little confusing to readers of the **Wonder Woman** title, seeing that Wonder Girl was supposed to be Wonder Woman in her teen years. It would later be explained that this Wonder Girl, although she looked identical to the teenaged Wonder Woman, was in fact a different person entirely.

The Immortal Man was introduced in **Strange Adventures** #177 (dated June 1965). He would appear only two more times in this title, in #185 and #190.

Mark Merlin died and his soul joined with Prince Ra-Man in **House Of Secrets** #73 (dated July-Aug 1965). Prince Ra-Man shared this title with Eclipso until the title's cancellation a year later.

After his two issue introduction in **The Brave And The Bold**, Metamorpho graduated to his own series, **Metamorpho** #1 (dated July-Aug 1965).

Animal Man was introduced in **Strange Adventures** #180 (dated Sep 1965). This character was not originally intended as a superhero per se, as evidenced by the fact that he wasn't given a costume until his third appearance.

Aquaman and Mera give birth to a baby boy in **Aquaman** #23 (dated Sep-Oct 1965). This poor child was awkwardly referred to as "Aquababy" throughout the series.

Lana Lang, the girl friend of the teenaged Clark Kent, became the Insect Queen for the first time in **Superboy** #124 (dated Oct 1965).

The origin of the Guardians of the Universe was revealed in **Green Lantern** #40 (dated Oct 1965), setting the stage for the Crisis On Infinite Earths two decades later.

Ultra the Multi-Alien, a bizarre-looking hybrid hero of the future, was introduced in **Mystery In Space** #103 (dated Nov 1965).

A rather unique feature was introduced in the Autumn of 1965 in **House Of Mystery** #156 (dated Jan 1966). In a series called "Dial 'H' For Hero", teenaged Robby Reed discovers an alien dial which allows him to transform, in a totally unpredictable manner, into various superheroes.

After two appearances in **The Brave And The Bold** and one in **Showcase**, the Teen Titans graduate to their own series, **Teen Titans** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1966).

The Enchantress was introduced in **Strange Adventures** #187 (dated Apr 1966). She would appear again in issues #191 and #200.

The team of incompetent teenaged heroes, who correctly dubbed themselves the Inferior Five, were introduced in **Showcase** #62 (dated May-June 1966) by E. Nelson Bridwell, Joe Orlando, and Mike Esposito.

Although most of the features introduced in the 1960s up to this point had gotten their starts in try-out titles, a new teen character was granted his own humor magazine called **Swing With Scooter** #1 (dated June-July 1966) without benefit of such a gimmick.

By the Spring of 1966, **The Brave And The Bold** had already switched to a team-up format. ABC-TV's Batman television series had debuted earlier that year and had been an instant success. Anxious to capitalize on the popularity of the television series, Batman was made the permanent co-star, beginning with **The Brave And The Bold** #67 (dated Aug-Sep 1966).

Barry Allen, the silver age Flash, married his girlfriend Iris West in **Flash** #165 (dated Nov 1966), in a story by John Broome and Carmine Infantino. One has to wonder what kind of faith Barry had in his wife, that he felt he couldn't trust her with his secret.

Quality Comics' former property, Plastic Man, was re-introduced in **Plastic Man** #1 (dated Nov-Dec 1966), by Arnold Drake and Gil Kane. A preview of sorts had taken place four months earlier in **House Of Mystery** #160, where Robby Reed used his H-Dial to become a duplicate of Plastic Man.

Batgirl, secretly the daughter of Batman's friend, Police Commissioner Gordon, was introduced in **Detective Comics** #359 (dated Jan 1967).

Thanks to a very odd editorial decision, the Blackhawks became super-heroes in **Blackhawk** #230 (dated Mar 1967). They came up with such catchy names as Big Eye, the Leaper, Dr. Hands, the Golden Centurion, the Listener, the Weapons Master, and M'sieu Machine.

After three issues in **Showcase**, the Inferior Five graduated to their own series, **Inferior Five** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1967), by E. Nelson Bridwell and Mike Sekowsky.

Aquagirl is introduced as a girl friend for Aqualad in **Aquaman** #33 (dated May-June 1967).

Another television show is translated into the four-color world with **Bomba, The Jungle Boy** #1 (Sep-Oct 1967).

An aerialist was murdered and became Deadman in **Strange Adventures** #205 (dated Oct 1967), by Arnold Drake and Carmine Infantino. The series followed the ghost through various adventures as he tried to find his hook-handed assassin.

After three consecutive issues of **Showcase**, the Spectre graduates to his own magazine, **The Spectre** #1 (dated Nov-Dec 1967).

A magazine called **Teen Beat** #1 (Nov-Dec 1967) is started in late 1967. It is renamed **Teen Beam** with its second, and last, issue.

**Tales Of The Unexpected** underwent a name change in late 1967, becoming simply **The Unexpected** with issue #105 (dated Feb-Mar 1968).

The Kents regained their youth in a story in **Superboy** #145 (dated Mar 1968). The most surprising thing about this tale was that it was one of the few Superboy stories which actually dared to push the envelope in regard to the restrictions placed upon this strip. After all, the adventures of Superman as a teen could not very well contradict the already established Superman mythos. (A later tale, wherein it was revealed that Superboy's real parents had survived Krypton's destruction in stasis but would die if revived, was another attempt at pushing the limits, but thankfully that story was ignored.)

Guy Gardner, the alternate Green Lantern, was introduced in **Green Lantern** #59 (dated Mar 1968), by John Broome and Gil Kane. This story revealed what would have happened if Hal Jordan was not available to become Earth's Green Lantern.

The Creeper, by Denny O'Neil and Steve Ditko, was introduced in **Showcase** #73 (dated Mar-Apr 1968).

A new team of adventurers were forced together by the mysterious Mockingbird in **Secret Six** #1 (Apr-May 1968), in a story by E. Nelson Bridwell and Frank Springer.

After two years as a backup feature, Stanley & His Monster took over **The Fox And The Crow** magazine, changing the title to **Stanley And His Monster** with issue #109 (Apr-May 1968).

The Flash traveled to Earth-Prime for the first time in **Flash** #179 (dated May 1968), by Cary Bates and Ross Andru. Earth-Prime was a world without super-powered characters, supposedly the very world which the reader themselves inhabited.

Anthro the caveboy was introduced in **Showcase** #74 (dated May 1968) by Howie Post.

The origin of the Legion of Super-Heroes was finally revealed by E. Nelson Bridwell and Pete Costanza, in **Superboy** #147 (dated May-June 1968). It is curious that it took ten long years for the fans of this popular team to learn how the Legion actually got their start.



The Creeper graduated from **Showcase** to his own series, **Beware The Creeper** #1 (dated May-June 1968), by Sergius O'Shaugnessy and Steve Ditko.

The format of **House Of Mystery** was changed from superhero to mystery starting in issue #174 (dated May-June 1968).

The Hawk and the Dove were introduced in **Showcase** #75 (dated June 1968) by Steve Skeates and Steve Ditko.

Anthro the caveboy graduated from **Showcase** to his own series, **Anthro** #1 (dated July-Aug 1968), by Howie Post.

The new Red Tornado was introduced as a new member of the Justice Society in **Justice League Of America** #64 (dated Aug 1968), by Gardner Fox and Dick Dillin. Whereas the original Red Tornado was an overweight housewife and mother dressed in a ridiculous outfit, this version was a formidable android capable of generating powerful winds and tornados.

Bat Lash, a western hero, was introduced in **Showcase** #76 (dated Aug 1968), by editor Joe Orlando, layouts by Sergio Aragones, Howie Post script, and Nick Cardy art.

The Hawk and the Dove graduated from **Showcase** to their own series, **The Hawk And The Dove** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1968), by Steve Skeates and Steve Ditko.

Angel and the Ape were introduced in **Showcase** #77 (dated Sep 1968) by editor Joe Orlando, E. Nelson Bridwell, Al Jaffee, Bob Oksner, Tex Blaisdell.

Brother Power, a rag doll brought to life by a freak accident, was introduced in **Brother Power, The Geek** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1968). This oddball series, written and drawn by Joe Simon, was cancelled after the second issue.

Cain was introduced as the host of an anthology of horror tales in **House Of Mystery** #176 (dated Sep-Oct 1968).

Ideal Toys' Captain Action and Action Boy were introduced into comic books in **Captain Action** #1 (dated Oct-Nov 1968), in a story by Jim Shooter and Wally Wood.

**DC Special** #1 (Oct-Nov 1968), a new reprint magazine, began publication in the Summer of 1968.

Hawkman, whose own title had been cancelled, was merged into the **Atom** series. The new title, **Atom And Hawkman**, took effect with issue #39 (dated Oct-Nov 1968).

Bat Lash graduated from **Showcase** to his own series, **Bat Lash #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1968), by Sergio Aragones, Denny O'Neil, and Nick Cardy.

A drastic change of direction took place in the Summer of 1968 in the long-running **Wonder Woman** magazine. In issue #179 (dated Nov-Dec 1968), Paradise Island faded into another dimension, prompting Princess Diana to give up her powers in order to remain on Earth. Her plain clothes adventures, which were aided by an elderly mystic named Ching, were chronicled by Denny O'Neil and Mike Sekowsky.

**Teen Titans #18** (dated Nov-Dec 1968) introduced the Soviet hero, Starfire, by Len Wein, Marv Wolfman, and Bill Draut.

Angel and the Ape graduated from **Showcase** to their own series, **Angel And The Ape #1** (dated Nov-Dec 1968), penciled by Bob Oksner.

Dolphin, a mysterious and beautiful stranger capable of living underwater, was introduced in **Showcase #79** (dated Dec 1968) by J. Scott Pike.

Another horror magazine, **Witching Hour #1** (dated Feb-Mar 1969), was introduced in the Autumn of 1968. It was hosted, appropriately enough, by three witches.

A handful of humor and romance magazines were begun in late 1968 and early 1969, bucking the superhero trend. Those titles included **Binky's Buddies #1** (Jan-Feb 1969), **Date With Debbie #1** (Jan-Feb 1969), **Debbie's Dates #1** (Apr-May 1969), and **Windy & Willy #1** (dated May-June 1969).

After being reintroduced in **Showcase** four months earlier, the Phantom Stranger graduated into his second series, **The Phantom Stranger v2 #1** (May-June 1969).

Supergirl takes over **Adventure Comics** from the Legion of Super-Heroes with issue #381 (dated June 1969), while the Legion moves over to a backup slot in **Action Comics**.

The origin of Wonder Girl is finally revealed, and the heroine dons a new costume, in **Teen Titans #22** (dated July-Aug 1969), by Marv Wolfman and Gil Kane.

Green Arrow donned a new costume in **The Brave & The Bold #85** (dated Aug-Sep 1969), courtesy of artist Neal Adams.

After a three-year hiatus, **House Of Secrets** returned, continuing it's numbering with #81 (dated Aug-Sep 1969). The format was changed to mystery, with Abel, brother of the House Of Mystery's Cain, as it's host..

A new science fiction anthology, **From Beyond The Unknown** #1 (dated Oct-Nov 1969), begins in the Summer of 1969.

The Losers, consisting of Captain Storm, Johnny Cloud, and Gunner & Sarge, were introduced in **G. I. Combat** #138 (dated Oct-Nov 1969), by Robert Kanigher and Russ Heath.

Black Canary crossed over from Earth-Two to Earth-One and joined the Justice League, gaining sonic powers in the process, in **Justice League Of America** #75 (dated Nov 1969), by Denny O'Neil and Dick Dillin. A romance between her and the newly garbed Green Arrow begins almost instantly.

**Angel And The Ape** became "**Meet Angel**" with issue #7 (dated Nov-Dec 1969). It was cancelled after a single issue.

The Vigilante returned after a long absence in **Justice League Of America** #78 (dated Feb 1970), by Denny O'Neil and Dick Dillin. It would later be revealed that the golden age Vigilante was lost in time during this period, making this the first appearance of his silver age counterpart.

Television's Hot Wheels gains it's own comic book, **Hot Wheels** #1 (dated Mar-Apr 1970), in the Winter of 1970.

And finally, **Leave It To Binky** becomes simply **Binky** with issue #72 (Apr-May 1970).

## DC Comics, A Retrospective

### Part Five: The Bronze Age

by John L. Censullo

At the dawn of the Bronze Age, National Periodicals' superhero magazines (**Action Comics, Adventure Comics, Aquaman, Batman, Blackhawk, The Brave & The Bold, DC Special, Detective Comics, 80-Page Giant, Flash, Green Lantern, Justice League Of America, Showcase, Superboy, Superman, Superman's Girl Friend Lois Lane, Superman's Pal Jimmy Olsen, Teen Titans, Wonder Woman, World's Finest Comics**) still only accounted for about 40% of their titles. There were still many science fiction and adventure titles (**From Beyond The Unknown, Strange Adventures, Challengers Of The Unknown, Tomahawk, Hot Wheels**), mystery and horror titles (**House Of Mystery, House Of Secrets, The Phantom Stranger, The Unexpected, Witching Hour**), and war titles (**G. I. Combat, Our Army At War, Our Fighting Forces, Star Spangled War Stories**) being published. Also, the humor comics (**The Adventures Of Jerry Lewis, Binky, Binky's Buddies, Sugar & Spike, Swing With Scooter**) and romance books (**Date With Debbi, Debbi's Dates, Falling In Love, Girl's Love Stories, Girl's Romances, Heart Throbs, Secret Hearts, Young Love, Young Romance Comics**) were still finding an audience. But by the end of the Bronze Age, the comic book field would look very different. At one point, things looked so dismal that many thought the end of comic books was imminent. The creation of the direct market in the late 1970s may well have been one contributing factor to the eventual turnaround. Another was the trend toward writing comic book tales which were accessible to all ages.

Denny O'Neil and Neal Adams took Green Lantern into a completely new and fresh direction beginning with **Green Lantern v2 #76** (dated Apr 1970). The stories, which co-starred Green Arrow, dealt with the social problems of the times, like race, poverty, hunger, overpopulation, and the environment.

Another humor book was added to the National Periodicals roster with **The Three Mouseketeers v2 #1** (dated May-June 1970).

**Detective Comics #400** (dated June 1970), by Frank Robbins and Neal Adams, introduced Man-Bat, a man who accidentally transforms himself into a true creature of the night.

Another war hero, the Unknown Soldier, was introduced in **Star Spangled War Stories #151** (dated June-July 1970), written and drawn by Joe Kubert.

A new western title, **All-Star Western v2 #1** (dated Aug-Sep 1970), was added in the Spring of 1970. El Diablo, a western hero with a supernatural slant, was introduced in issue #2 (dated Oct-Nov 1970), by Robert Kanigher and Gray Morrow.

Another reprint series, **Super DC Giant**, was also added to the ranks in the Spring of 1970. This title was published at irregular intervals and, for some odd reason, started its numbering with #S-13 (dated Sep-Oct 1970).

Jack Kirby came back over from Marvel Comics and began his Fourth World saga in the Summer of 1970. Kirby completely revamped **Superman's Pal, Jimmy Olsen** starting with issue #133 (dated Oct 1970). In his first issue, he introduced the children of the Newsboy Legion, characters he had co-created during the golden age.

**Superman's Girl Friend, Lois Lane #105** (dated Oct 1970) introduced Rose & Thorn, created and written by Robert Kanigher. Thorn appeared in the first story with art by Saaf and Andru, then her origin was revealed in the backup feature drawn by Andru.

**Tomahawk #131** (dated Nov-Dec 1970) was taken into a new direction with the introduction of Hawk, son of Tomahawk, by Bob Kanigher and Frank Thorne.

One of the most powerful and evil villains in all of comics, Darkseid of Apokolips, was introduced in **Superman's Pal Jimmy Olsen #134** (dated Dec 1970). The readers would have to wait two more months to learn what Jack Kirby had planned for this master of evil.

The trend towards change continued when green kryptonite was destroyed, and Clark Kent moved to WGBS-TV, in **Superman #233** (dated Jan 1971), by Denny O'Neil and Curt Swan. A sand creature from the dimension of Quarrm, which would play a significant role in the life of Superman over the next eight months, took form and began leeching Superman's power beginning in this issue.

In **Superman's Pal Jimmy Olsen #135** (dated Jan 1971), Jack Kirby introduced the clone of the Guardian, another of his golden age creations.

The Heroes of Angor, a team of heroes patterned after Marvel Comics' Avengers, were introduced in **Justice League Of America #87** (dated Feb 1971), by Mike Friedrich and Dick Dillin. At this same time, Marvel Comics did their own parody of the Justice League when they had the Avengers meet the Squadron Supreme. Although Silver Sorceress (Scarlet Witch), Wandjina (Thor), Blue Jay (Yellowjacket), and Jack B. Quick (Quicksilver) were intended as one-shots, they would eventually turn up again a decade and a half hence.

Jack Kirby's Fourth World saga continued, flowing through a total of four titles. The first issues of **The Forever People** (dated Feb-Mar 1971) and **The New Gods** (dated Feb-Mar 1971) appeared in the Autumn of 1970. The first issue of **Mister Miracle #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1971) appeared the following month.

A new 100-page, square-bound comic book, **DC 100-Page Super Spectacular**, began publication in 1971. Like **Super DC Giant**, this reprint series did not begin its numbering with #1. The first issue, labeled issue #4 (dated 1971), featured **Weird Mystery Tales**.

The original version of the Swamp Thing was introduced in a story in **House Of Secrets #92** (dated June-July 1971), by Len Wein and Berni Wrightson.

Green Arrow learned that his former partner, Speedy, had become a heroin addict in **Green Lantern #85-86** (dated Aug-Sep 1971, Oct-Nov 1971), Denny O'Neil and Neal Adams. Because these issues dealt with drug abuse, neither cover displayed the Comics Code Authority symbol.

In **Superman #242** (dated Sep 1971), Superman allowed the sand creature from Quarrm, who had drained one-third of his power, to keep the stolen energies, thus depowering the Man Of Steel. This story, by Denny O'Neil and Curt Swan, served to lessen Superman's near infinite power, something that was necessary (from a writer's standpoint) after the destruction of Superman's primary weakness, green kryptonite.

A number of new horror magazines debuted in the Summer of 1970. These were **Weird War Tales** (dated Sep-Oct 1971), **Ghosts #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1971), **The Dark Mansion Of Forbidden Love #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1971), and **The Sinister House Of Secret Love #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1971). **Spirit World #1** (Fall 1971), a one-shot b&w magazine containing Kirby art, also appeared at this time.

**Green Lantern v2 #87** (dated Dec 1971-Jan 1972) introduces John Stewart, the substitute Green Lantern, by Denny O'Neil and Neal Adams.

Jonah Hex is introduced in issue **All-Star Western v2 #10** (dated Feb-Mar 1972), created by writer John Albano, with art by Tony DeZuñiga.

National took over publication of Edgar Rice Burroughs' **Tarzan** from Gold Key Comics in the Winter of 1972, with issue #207 (dated Apr 1972). This title also featured ERB's John Carter, Warlord of Mars. Joe Kubert wrote and drew the Tarzan feature, and also supplied the scripts for the John Carter backup.

The next month, National took over publication of ERB's **Korak, Son Of Tarzan** from Gold Key with issue #46 (dated May-June 1972). This title featured Korak by Len Wein and Frank Thorne, Carson of Venus by Wein and Mike Kaluta, and Pellucidar by Wein and Alan Weiss.

**The Dark Mansion Of Forbidden Love** becomes **Forbidden Tales Of Dark Mansion** #5 (dated May-June 1972). **Sinister House Of Secret Love** becomes **Secrets Of Sinister House** #5 (dated June-July 1972). The title **All-Star Western** is renamed **Weird Western Tales** with issue #12 (dated June-July 1972). **Weird Mystery Tales** #1 (dated July-Aug 1972).

**Wanted: The World's Most Dangerous Villains** #1 (dated July-Aug 1972), a reprint magazine dedicated to super-villains, started publication in the Spring of 1972.

Standard and digest versions of **Larry Harmon's Laurel And Hardy** #1 (dated July-Aug 1972) one-shot also appeared in the Spring of '72.

The Seven Soldiers Of Victory, a team last seen during the golden age, were brought back in **Justice League Of America** #100-102 (dated Aug, Sep, and Oct 1972), by Len Wein and Dick Dillin. It was explained that, a few years after the war, these heroes were lost in time following a great battle. This issue clearly established that there existed distinct versions of Green Arrow, Speedy, and the Vigilante on both Earths-One and Two.

Jack Kirby struck again in the Spring of 1972 with the release of the first issue of **The Demon** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1972).

After it's prior cancellation, the Inferior Five returned in **Inferior 5** #11 (dated Aug-Sep 1972). The revived book lasted two issues, and both contained only reprints.

Fritz Leiber's Fafhrd & the Gray Mouser were introduced into the comic book world in **Wonder Woman** #201-202 (dated July-Aug 1972, Sep-Oct 1972), in a story by Denny O'Neil, Samuel R. Delaney, and Dick Giordano.

National continued adapting works by Edgar Rice Burroughs starting in **Weird Worlds** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1972). This title featured David Innes in Pellucidar and John Carter, Warlord of Mars.

Another Kirby title, **Kamandi, Last Boy On Earth** #1 (dated Oct-Nov 1972), debuted in the Summer of '72. This series was thought by some to be a Planet Of The Apes rip-off, but it was actually based on an idea Jack had proposed for a newspaper strip many years earlier.

The Swamp Thing, a character which had debuted more than a year earlier in **House Of Secrets**, was revamped by Wein and Wrightson and granted his own title, **Swamp Thing #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1972).

By 1972, it had been long established that the universe was regularly patrolled by the Green Lantern Corps, a force for good run by the near-omnipotent Guardians of the Universe. It was revealed in **Superman #257** (dated Oct 1972) that the Green Lantern of Space Sector 2813, Tomar-Re, had failed in his attempt to stop the destruction of the planet Krypton, a world under his jurisdiction. This tale was presented by Elliot S! Maggin and Dick Dillin, based on an idea by Neal Adams.

**Heart Throbs** becomes **Love Stories** with issue #147 (dated Nov 1972).

Supergirl graduates from **Adventure Comics** into her own series, **Supergirl #1** (dated Nov 1972), by Cary Bates and Art Saaf. The title of **Adventure Comics** would more accurately reflect it's contents with the next issue, #425 (dated Dec 1972-Jan 1973), when the magazine switches to pure adventure. That first issue introduced Captain Fear, by Robert Kanigher and Alex Niño. Such features as The Adventurers' Club and Black Orchid would follow.

National Periodicals published it's first tabloid-sized book starting with **Limited Collectors' Edition #C-20** (dated Dec 1972), featuring Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer. This reprint magazine continued the odd practice of starting certain titles with a random numbering system.

**World's Finest Comics #215** (Dec 1972-Jan 1973) introduced the Super-Sons, by Bob Haney and Dick Dillin. This feature, set two decades or so in the future, starred Superman Jr. and Batman Jr., the sons of the original heroes.

**Wonder Woman #204** (dated Jan-Feb 1973) featured the death of Ching and the return of Diana to her super-heroine costume. This issue, by Robert Kanigher and Don Heck, also introduced Nubia, Wonder Woman's forgotten sister.

The first issue of **Shazam!** (dated Feb 1973), by Denny O'Neil and C.C. Beck, featured the return of Fawcett Publications' Captain Marvel. National Periodicals had purchased the character from Fawcett quite a few years earlier, but unfortunately did nothing with him. This had enabled Marvel Comics to publish a *Captain Marvel* book of their own, trademarking the title. National utilized the original Captain Marvel's magic word, SHAZAM!, as the title for the new series.



**Adventure Comics** #426 (dated Feb-Mar 1973) introduced The Adventurers' Club feature, by John Albano and Jim Aparo.

After appearing a half year earlier in the **Wonder Woman** title, Fritz Leiber's Fafhrd & the Gray Mouser graduated to their own magazine, **Sword Of Sorcery** (dated Feb-Mar 1973), by Denny O'Neil and Howard Chaykin.

A number of cancelled series resumed publication as reprints in the Autumn of 1972. **The Doom Patrol** #122 (dated Feb 1973), **Challengers Of The Unknown** #78 (dated Feb 1973), and **Metal Men** #42 (dated Feb-Mar 1973) all lasted for three issues a piece. New reprint titles also appeared. **Legion Of Super-Heroes** (dated Feb 1973) only lasted for four issues, but led to a new feature in the **Superboy** magazine. **Secret Origins** (dated Feb-Mar 1973) lasted for seven issues, with a huge publishing gap between issues #6 and #7. **Johnny Thunder** (dated Feb-Mar 1973) lasted three issues. **Four-Star Battle Tales** (dated Feb-Mar 1973) lasted six issues. **G. I. War Tales** (dated Mar-Apr 1973) lasted four issues. **Trigger Twins** (dated Mar-Apr 1973) never got past issue #1.

The mysterious Black Orchid was introduced in **Adventure Comics** #428 (dated July-Aug 1973), in a story by Sheldon Mayer and Tony DeZuñiga.

**Prez** #1 (dated Aug-Sep 1973), an oddball series by Joe Simon and Jerry Grandenetti, featured the adventures of a teenage U.S. President.

**The Amazing World Of Superman, Metropolis Edition** (dated 1973), a special, limited b&w tabloid, was published especially for the opening of a Superman theme park in Metropolis, Illinois.

A handful of heroes purchased from the defunct Quality Comics were brought back as the Freedom Fighters in **Justice League Of America** #107-108 (dated Sep-Oct and Nov-Dec 1973), by Len Wein and Dick Dillin. This team resided on Earth-X, a world where the Nazis had won World War II.

The Legion of Super-Heroes were featured full-time in Superboy's magazine starting with **Superboy** #197 (dated Sep 1973), in a tale by Cary Bates and Dave Cockrum.

A new humor magazine, **Plop!** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1973), began in the Summer of 1973.

The trend towards reprint titles continued with **Boy Commandos** (dated Sep-Oct 1973). The series lasted a mere two issues.

Two new sports comics were added to the ranks with **Strange Sports Stories #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1973) and **Champion Sports #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1973).

National added yet another reprint title, **Black Magic** (dated Oct-Nov 1973), which represented some old Simon and Kirby horror tales.

National leased the rights from Conde Nast to publish **The Shadow #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1973), by Denny O'Neil and Mike Kaluta.

**Detective Comics #437** (dated Oct-Nov 1973), introduced the new Manhunter, a major revamp of a minor golden age character, by Archie Goodwin and Walter Simonson.

The Batman met the Shadow for the first time in **Batman #253** (dated Nov 1973), in a tale by Denny O'Neil and Irv Novick.

**Weird Worlds #8** (dated Nov-Dec 1973), introduced Ironwolf, a character created and drawn by Howard Chaykin, written by Denny O'Neil.

Joe Simon and Jack Kirby, who had worked on the Sandman feature for much of the golden age, created a new version of the character for a one-shot entitled **The Sandman #1** (dated Winter 1974). Sales on that one-shot proved good enough that the book returned as an ongoing title a year later.

A new tabloid-sized reprint book, **Famous First Edition #C-26** (dated 1974), appeared in 1974. This series, which continued its numbering from **Limited Collectors' Edition #C-25**, reprinted many desirable golden age books in their entirety, beginning with Action Comics #1.

Joe Orlando, Michael Fleisher, and Jim Aparo joined together to create the controversial Spectre feature, which began in **Adventure Comics #431** (dated Jan-Feb 1974).

In the Winter of 1974, both **Superman's Pal, Jimmy Olsen** and **Superman's Girl Friend, Lois Lane** were cancelled. These long-running series were replaced with **The Superman Family #164** (dated Apr-May 1974), continuing its numbering from the **Jimmy Olsen** title.

**Rima, The Jungle Girl #1** (dated Apr-May 1974), by Bob Kanigher and Nestor Redondo, was based on a character from W.H. Hudson's "Green Mansions".

Superman met Captain Thunder for the first and only time in **Superman #276** (dated June 1974), by Elliot S! Maggin and Curt Swan. Being that Captain Thunder was a direct swipe of Captain Marvel, this tale was probably intended to show what would happen if Marvel encountered the Man of Steel.

In **Flash #228** (dated July-Aug 1974), in a tale by Cary Bates and Irv Novick, the Cary Bates of Earth-Prime visits Earth-One for the first time.

Sandy the Golden Boy, former sidekick of the Sandman, was brought back in **Justice League Of America #113** (dated Sep-Oct 1974). In that tale, by Len Wein and Dick Dillin, it is revealed that, many years earlier, the Sandman had unintentionally turned his partner into a mindless silicon creature. Sandy was eventually cured of his condition.

**Omac #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1974), the next title by Jack Kirby, introduced the One Man Army Corps (OMAC) into “The World That’s Coming”.

The Batman met the Shadow for the second time in **Batman #259** (dated Nov-Dec 1974), by Denny O’Neil and Irv Novick.

Sixteen year-old Charley Parker, the Golden Eagle, was introduced in **Justice League Of America #116** (dated Mar-Apr 1975), by Cary Bates and Dick Dillin.

Beowulf, a dragon-slaying hero from an 8th century Anglo-Saxon poem of the same name, was adapted into comic book form beginning with **Beowulf #1** (dated Apr-May 1975), by Michael Uslan and Ricardo Villamonte.

**Richard Dragon, Kung-Fu Fighter #1** (dated Apr-May 1975), by Jim Dennis and Leopoldo Durañona, introduced characters based on Dennis’ book “Dragon’s Fists”.

A new horror magazine, **Secrets Of Haunted House #1** (dated Apr-May 1975), was started in the Winter of 1975.

A new showcasing magazine, **1st Issue Special #1** (dated Apr 1975), appeared at the start of 1975. The first issue introduced Atlas, another Jack Kirby creation.

One of Batman’s most deadly foes gained his own magazine with **The Joker #1** (dated May 1975), by Denny O’Neil and Irv Novick. This was the first time a villain starred in his own ongoing title.

A new sword and sorcery title, **Claw The Unconquered #1** (dated May-June 1975), by David Michelinie and Ernie Chua, was introduced in the Winter of 1975.

National leased another set of characters from Conde Nast, the Avenger and Justice. Inc., and starred them in a new title, **Justice, Inc.** #1 (dated May-June 1975), by Denny O'Neil and Al McWilliams.

**Tales Of Ghost Castle** #1 (dated May-June 1975), a new horror magazine, debuted in the Winter of '75.

Joe Kubert brought back a character he had worked on in the early 1950's from the St. John Publications title "One Million Years Ago" in **Tor** #1 (dated May-June 1975).

The Green Team were introduced in **1st Issue Special** #2 (dated May 1975) by Joe Simon and Jerry Grandenetti.

A month after their debut at National, Justice, Inc. met the Shadow in **The Shadow** #11 (dated June-July 1975), by Michael Uslan and E.R. Cruz.

The next sword and sorcery title to appear, **Stalker** #1 (dated June-July 1975), was created by Paul Levitz, Steve Ditko, and Wally Wood.

The adventures of a young prehistoric child began in **Kong The Untamed** #1 (dated June-July 1975), by Jack Oleck and Alfred Alcala.

Adam Strange finally married the love of his life, Alanna of Rann, in **Justice League Of America** #121 (dated Aug 1975), by Cary Bates and Dick Dillin.

Yet another Manhunter was introduced in **1st Issue Special** #5 (dated Aug 1975), by Jack Kirby. This Manhunter would return in **Justice League Of America** #140-141, in a story which introduced the concept of the android Manhunters.

The world's most famous detective gained his own one-shot with **Sherlock Holmes** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1975), by Denny O'Neil and E.R. Cruz.

Aquaman replaced the Spectre beginning with **Adventure Comics** #441 (dated Sep-Oct 1975), in a feature by Paul Levitz and Jim Aparo.

**The Batman Family** #1 (dated Sep-Oct 1975) debuted in the Summer of 1975. It started out as a reprint magazine, but finished out it's run with all new stories.

Jack Kirby's Dingbats of Danger Street were introduced in **1st Issue Special** #6 (dated Sep 1975).

The Earth-Prime Cary Bates and Elliot S! Maggin are transported to Earth-One and Earth-Two in **Justice League Of America** #123-124 (dated Oct-Nov 1975), in a tale by Cary Bates, Elliot S! Maggin, and Dick Dillin.

A post-apocalyptic Hercules debuts in **Hercules Unbound** #1 (dated Oct-Nov 1975), written by Gerry Conway, with art by José Luis Garcia Lopez and Wally Wood.

Another reprint title, **Super-Team Family** (dated Oct-Nov 1975), debuts in the Summer of 1975, eventually changing it's format to new material.

**Korak, Son Of Tarzan** became **Tarzan Family** with issue #60 (dated Nov-Dec 1975)

Mike Grell's Warlord, Travis Morgan, was introduced in **1st Issue Special** #8 (dated Nov 1975).

The first joint venture between Marvel and National, **MGM's Marvelous Wizard Of Oz** #1 (dated 1975), was a tabloid adapting the classic movie.

One of Batman's supporting cast members was granted his own title with **Man-Bat** #1 (dated Dec 1975-Jan 1976), by Gerry Conway and Steve Ditko.

The Justice Society Of America returned in the revived **All-Star Comics** #58 (dated Jan-Feb 1976), by Gerry Conway, Ric Estrada, and Wally Wood. This issue also introduced Power Girl, the cousin of the Earth-Two Superman, and added the Star-Spangled Kid to the ranks.

A different kind of war magazine, **Blitzkrieg** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1976), featured tales of World War Two as seen through the eyes of the enemy.

Mike Grell's Warlord became the first character to graduate from **1st Issue Special**, with **The Warlord** #1 (dated Jan-Feb 1976).

The original Outsiders were introduced in **1st Issue Special** #10 (dated Jan 1976), by Joe Simon and Jerry Grandenetti.

**Kobra** #1 (dated Feb-Mar 1976), by Martin Pasko and Jack Kirby, appeared in the Autumn of 1975. This was the second ongoing title to feature a villain as it's star.

Code Name: Assassin was introduced in **1st Issue Special** #11 (dated Feb 1976), by Gerry Conway and Steve Keates, with the Redondo Studio.

Plastic Man's title was revived with **Plastic Man #11** (dated Feb-Mar 1976), by Steve Skeates and Ramona Fradon.

One of the Legion of Super-Heroes lesser members gained his own magazine with **Karate Kid #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1976), by Paul Levitz and Ric Estrada.

The Freedom Fighters, a team of heroes from Earth-X, migrate to Earth-One in **Freedom Fighters #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1976). This title was by Martin Pasko and Ric Estrada, based on a Gerry Conway plot.

A blue-skinned Starman was introduced in **1st Issue Special #12** (dated Mar 1976), by Gerry Conway and Mike Vosburg.

Another title, **DC Super Stars #1** (dated Mar 1976), would start out as a reprint series, but later change to new material. A second reprint title, **Four Star Spectacular #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1976), appeared in the same month.

**Superman vs. The Amazing Spider-Man #1** (dated 1976), a tabloid one-shot by Gerry Conway and Ross Andru, marked the first company crossover between National and Marvel Comics.

New tales of the Metal Men began in their revived title, **Metal Men #45** (dated Apr-May 1976), by Steve Gerber and Walt Simonson.

The New Gods returned briefly in **1st Issue Special #13** (dated Apr 1976), by Gerry Conway, Denny O'Neil, and Mike Vosburg.

The third book to have villains as the stars, **Secret Society Of Super-Villains #1** (dated May-June 1976), appeared in the Winter of 1976. This series was created by Gerry Conway and Pablo Marcos. An alternate, earlier version of issue #1 appeared in **The Amazing World Of DC Comics #11**, by Gerry Conway and Ric Estrada.

Green Lantern returned was revived with all new stories in **Green Lantern #90** (dated Aug-Sep 1976), by Denny O'Neil and Mike Grell.

A new sword and sorcery series, **Starfire #1** (dated Aug-Sep 1976), debuted in 1976, thanks to David Michelinie and Mike Vosburg.

A poor man's hero, the Ragman, was introduced in **Ragman #1** (dated Aug-Sep 1976), created by Joe Kubert and Bob Kanigher, with art by the Redondo Studio.

Isis, a Filmmation TV creation, was introduced into the world of comic books in **Shazam! #25** (dated Sep-Oct 1976), by Denny O'Neil and Dick Giordano. She gained her own title the following month with **Isis #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1976), written by Denny O'Neil, with art by Ric Estrada and Wally Wood.

Heroes leased from Fawcett Publications, the original home of Captain Marvel, were brought back as the Shazam's Squadron of Justice in **Justice League Of America #135** (dated Oct 1976), based on a plot by E. Nelson Bridwell, with script by Marty Pasko and art by Dick Dillin.

Two television shows were adapted in comic book form in the Summer of 1976. **Super Friends #1** (dated Nov 1976) by E. Nelson Bridwell and Ric Estrada and **Welcome Back, Kotter #1** (dated Nov 1976), by Elliot S! Maggin and Jack Sparling.

The Teen Titans returned to action in the revived **Teen Titans #44** (dated Nov 1976), by Paul Levitz, Bob Rozakis, and Pablo Marcos.

**Super-Heroes Battle Super-Gorillas #1** (Winter 1976), a one-shot reprint featuring the gorilla craze, appeared in late 1976.

National Periodicals Publications, Inc. was officially renamed DC Comics, Inc. at the start of 1977.

A special series of one-shots, collectively called **DC Special Series**, debuted in 1977. The first of these was called **5-Star Super-Hero Spectacular** (dated 1977).

The secret of the Manhunters was revealed in **Justice League Of America #140-#141** (dated Mar-Apr 1977), by Steve Englehart and Dick Dillin.

Jonah Hex graduated from **Weird Western Tales** to his own title, **Jonah Hex #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1977), by Michael Fleisher and José Luis Garcia Lopez. The Scalphunter took over **Weird Western Tales** with issue #39 (dated Mar-Apr 1977). This character was created by Joe Orlando and Sergio Aragones, written by Michael Fleisher, and penciled by Dick Ayers.

After nearly twenty years as it's star, the title **Our Army At War** was renamed **Sgt. Rock** with issue #302 (dated Mar 1977). The title **Star Spangled War Stories** was renamed **Unknown Soldier** with issue #205 (dated Apr-May 1977).

Black Lightning is introduced in **Black Lightning #1** (dated Apr 1977), created and written by Tony Isabella, with art by Trevor Von Eeden.

A character called Willow, a parody of Marvel Comics' Mantis, was introduced in **Justice League Of America** #142 (dated May 1977), by Steve Englehart and Dick Dillin.

The new Nightwing and Flamebird of Kandor were introduced in **Superman Family** #183 (May-June 1977), by Paul Kupperberg and Carl Potts.

The latest Manhunter, Mark Shaw, became the Privateer in **Justice League Of America** #143 (dated June 1977), by Steve Englehart and Dick Dillin. It would not be discovered until issue #150 that Shaw had turned to a life of crime.

Following a few appearances in **Super-Team Family**, the Challengers return in new tales in the revived **Challengers Of The Unknown** #81 (dated June-July 1977), by Gerry Conway and Mike Nasser.

**Shade, the Changing Man** #1 (dated June-July 1977), by Michael Fleisher and Steve Ditko, joined the line-up in the Spring of 1977.

The secret origin of the Justice League was finally revealed in **Justice League Of America** #144 (dated July 1977), by Steve Englehart and Dick Dillin. The Challengers Of The Unknown, the Blackhawks, Vigilante and Stuff, Plastic Man, Robotman, Congo Bill and the Congorilla, and Rex the Wonder Dog all appeared in the flashback tale.

After a successful try-out in **1st Issue Special**, the New Gods' own title is revived with **New Gods** #12 (dated July 1977), by Gerry Conway and Don Newton.

In **Adventure Comics** #452 (dated July-Aug 1977), Aquaman was forced to battle Aqualad over the life of his child. The battle was supposed to be to the death. Although both heroes ultimately survived, Aquaman's choice drove a permanent wedge between the two.

Code Name: Gravedigger, another feature set during World War Two, was introduced in **Men Of War** #1 (dated Aug 1977), by David Michelinie and Ed Davis.

**Showcase** #94 (dated Aug-Sep 1977) resumed publication in the Spring of '77. The first few issues, by Paul Kupperberg and Joe Staton, introduced the new Doom Patrol.

Aquaman graduated from **Adventure Comics** to his own revived series with **Aquaman** #57 (dated Aug-Sep 1977), by David Michelinie and Jim Aparo.



The Legion of Super-Heroes finally shared top-billing with Superboy in his own title when **Superboy** became **Superboy & The Legion Of Super-Heroes #231** (dated Sep 1977).

Mister Miracle returned in his revived series, **Mister Miracle #19** (dated Sep 1977), by Steve Englehart and Marshall Rogers.

After first being introduced in **DC Super-Stars #16** (Sep-Oct 1977), the Star Hunters graduated to their own magazine, **Star Hunters #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1977), by David Michelinie and Don Newton.

The Huntress, daughter of the Earth-Two Batman, was introduced in **DC Super-Stars #17** (dated Nov-Dec 1977) by Paul Levitz and Joe Staton. She appeared that same month in **All-Star Comics #69** (dated Nov-Dec 1977), also by Levitz and Staton.

**Limited Collectors' Edition**, the tabloid series, switched from reprint to new material, becoming **All New Collectors' Edition #C-53** (dated 1978).

Air Wave II, son of the original and cousin to Green Lantern, was introduced in **Green Lantern #100** (dated Jan 1978), by Denny O'Neil and Alex Saviuk.

**Doorway To Nightmare #1** (dated Jan-Feb 1978) introduced Madame Xanadu, by David Micheline and Val Mayerik.

**Teen Titans** was cancelled with #53 (dated Feb 1978), but not before Bob Rozakis and Juan Ortiz revealed the secret origin of Teen Titans, more than a dozen years after their first appearance.

Due to injuries suffered in **Adventure Comics #452**, the son of Aquaman and Mera died in **Aquaman #60** (dated Feb-Mar 1978), causing a rift between the hero and his wife.

Firestorm the Nuclear Man, a hero that was formed when two men were fused together in a nuclear accident, was introduced in **Firestorm #1** (dated Mar 1978), created by Gerry Conway and Al Milgrom.

A new hero, Steel, was retroactively inserted into golden age DC history, beginning with **Steel, The Indestructible Man #1** (dated Mar 1978), by Gerry Conway and Don Heck.

Earth-Prime's first superhero, Ultraa, was introduced in **Justice League Of America #153** (dated Apr 1978), by Gerry Conway and George Tuska. Ultraa relocated to Earth-One in the hopes that that would prevent the emergence of super-villains on his home Earth.

The previously cancelled sword and sorcery title, **Claw The Unconquered**, was revived with issue #10 (dated Apr-May 1978).

**Action Comics #484** (dated June 1978), by Cary Bates and Curt Swan, featured the wedding of the Earth-Two Superman and Lois Lane, exactly forty years after the couple were first introduced.

Superman gained his first team-up magazine, **DC Comics Presents #1** (dated July-Aug 1978), in the Spring of 1978. The first two issues teamed Superman with the Flash in a tale by Martin Pasko and José Luis Garcia Lopez.

Although DC Comics had started off the year optimistically hyping an expansion of their line in what they dubbed the "DC Explosion", the harsh realities of the failing comic book market forced massive cancellations of their titles by the start of the Summer of '78. The "DC Implosion", as it would later be called, was truly a low point in comic book history. In order to secure copyright on all the material that was pulled from the printers, DC made thirty-five photocopies of the artwork and bound them into two volumes, **Cancelled Comic Cavalcade #1** (Summer 1978) - #2 (Fall 1978), distributing them among the DC offices.

Because of the dreaded "DC Implosion", three new reprint titles, **Battle Classics #1** (dated Sept-Oct 1978), **Dynamic Classics #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1978), and **Army At War #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1978), were cancelled after their first issues.

The death of Jonah Hex was presented in **Jonah Hex Spectacular (DC Special Series #16)** (dated Fall 1978), by Michael Fleisher and Russ Heath.

**Adventure Comics #462** (Mar-Apr 1979), featured the death of the Earth-Two Batman, by Paul Levitz and Joe Staton.

The secret origin of Zatanna was revealed in **Justice League Of America #164** (dated Mar 1979), by Gerry Conway and Dick Dillin.

Guy Gardner became a Green Lantern for the first time in **Green Lantern #116** (dated May 1979), by Denny O'Neil and Alex Saviuk.

The first mini-series published by DC Comics, **The World Of Krypton #1-#3** (dated July 1979 through Sep 1979), appeared in the Spring of 1978. This series was created by Paul Kupperberg and Howard Chaykin.

In **Flash #275-#276** (dated July and Aug 1979), by Cary Bates and Alex Saviuk, the unthinkable happened. Iris Allen, wife of the silver age Flash, was brutally murdered. Only later would the Flash learn that her killer was one of his deadliest enemies, Professor Zoom.

**Detective Comics #485** (dated Aug-Sep 1979) featured the death of Batwoman, by Denny O'Neil and Don Newton.

The Viking Commando was introduced in **All-Out War #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1979), by Robert Kanigher and George Evans.

Two new reprint digests were added to the roster with **The Best Of DC #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1979) and **Jonah Hex And Other Western Tales #1** (dated Sep-Oct 1979).

Mr. Terrific, a member of the Justice Society, was murdered in **Justice League Of America #171** (dated Oct 1979), by Gerry Conway and Dick Dillin.

The science fiction title, **Time Warp #1** (dated Oct-Nov 1979), debuted in the Summer of '79.

**All New Collectors' Edition #C-62** (dated 1979) adapted "Superman: The Movie" in the oversized tabloid format.

The Odd Man, a victim of the "DC Implosion" who was originally slated to appear in **Shade, The Changing Man #9**, was finally introduced in **Detective Comics #487** (dated Dec 1979-Jan 1980) in a tale by Steve Ditko.

The Legion of Super-Heroes took over the **Superboy & The Legion Of Super-Heroes** title completely, renaming it **Legion Of Super-Heroes v2** with issue #259 (dated Jan 1980). In turn, Superboy gained a new title called **The New Adventures Of Superboy #1** (dated Jan 1980), by Cary Bates and Kurt Schaffenberger. In that first issue, Superboy celebrated his sixteenth birthday.

The newest Starman, Prince Gavyn, was introduced in **Adventure Comics #467** (dated Jan 1980), written and created by Paul Levitz, designed and drawn by Steve Ditko.

Another reprint digest title joined the ranks with **DC Special Blue Ribbon Digest #1** (dated Mar-Apr 1980).

The second DC mini-series, **The Untold Legend Of Batman #1-#3** (dated July 1980 through Sep 1980), appeared in the Spring of 1980. This series was created by Len Wein, John Byrne, and Jim Aparo.

One of DC's science fiction titles was revived, after a fourteen year hiatus, with **Mystery In Space #111** (dated Sep 1980).

## DC Comics, A Retrospective

### Part Six: The Iron Age

At the start of the Iron Age, superhero titles (**Action Comics, Adventure Comics, Batman, The Brave & The Bold, DC Comics Presents, DC Special Series, Detective Comics, Green Lantern v2, Justice League Of America, Legion Of Super-Heroes v2, The New Adventures Of Superboy, Super Friends, Superman, The Superman Family, Wonder Woman, World's Finest Comics**) dominated the comic book scene. Yes, there were still some horror magazines (**Ghosts, The House Of Mystery, Secrets Of Haunted House, The Unexpected**) and war books (**G.I. Combat, Sgt. Rock, Unknown Soldier, Weird War Tales**). And there was still one western title (**Jonah Hex**), one science fiction title (**Mystery In Space**), one sword & sorcery title (**Warlord v1**), and two reprint digests (**Best Of DC, DC Special Blue Ribbon Digest**). But the market was now clearly geared towards the superhero genre. Thankfully though, DC Comics would continue expand it's scope beyond the superhero in order to reach other audiences. Their TSR line of books, for instance, tapped into the Advanced Dungeons and Dragons market, while their Piranha Press and Vertigo imprints were aimed at a more mature audience.

Marv Wolfman and George Pérez updated and presented a New Teen Titans in **DC Comics Presents #26** (dated Oct 1980), which then continued in its own title, **New Teen Titans #1** (dated Nov 1980).

**Weird War Tales #93** (dated Nov 1980) introduced the Creature Commandos, by J.M. DeMatteis and Pat Broderick.

**Secrets Of The Legion Of Super-Heroes #1-#3** (dated Jan 1981 through Mar 1981), a three-issue mini-series by E. Nelson Bridwell, Paul Kupperberg, and Jim Janes, recapped the long history of the Legion and revealed that one of it's members was the son of the team's financier.

Marv Wolfman and Carmine Infantino revamped the Dial 'H' For HERO feature, replacing Robby Reed with Chris King and Vicki Grant, in a preview in **Legion Of Super-Heroes v2 #272** (dated Feb 1981). The feature then took over **Adventure Comics** with issue #479 (dated Mar 1981).

Another mini-series, **Tales Of The Green Lantern Corps #1-#3** (dated May 1981 through July 1981) by Mike W. Barr, Len Wein, and Joe Staton, featured the intergalactic Green Lantern Corps.

The Omega Men were introduced in **Green Lantern v2 #141** (dated June 1981), by Marv Wolfman and Joe Staton.

**Superman II: The Adventure Continues [DC Special Series #25]** (dated Summer 1981) adapted the second Superman movie into comic book form.

The Vixen, a character originally scheduled to appear in her own magazine in 1978 but who fell victim to the “DC Implosion”, finally appeared for the first time in **Action Comics #521** (dated July 1981), by Gerry Conway and Curt Swan.

**Weird War Tales #101** (dated July 1981) introduced the G.I. Robot, created and written by Robert Kanigher, with art by Pepe Morino Casaris.

The true origin of the Red Tornado was revealed in **Justice League Of America #192-193** (dated July 1981 and Aug 1981), by Gerry Conway and George Pérez. Issue #193 also previewed the All-Star Squadron, by Roy Thomas and Jerry Ordway. The All-Star Squadron, a series set on Earth-Two at the dawn of America’s involvement in WWII, then continued in **All-Star Squadron #1** (dated Sep 1981)

**Krypton Chronicles #1-#3** (dated Sep 1981 through Nov 1981), a mini-series by E. Nelson Bridwell and Curt Swan, detailed the history of Superman’s homeworld.

Arak, created by Roy Thomas and Ernie Colón, was introduced in a preview in **Warlord #48** (dated Aug 1981), then continued in his own title, **Arak, Son Of Thunder #1** (dated Sep 1981).

**The Superman Family #211** (dated Oct 1981) featured the wedding of the Earth-Two Batman and Catwoman, by E. Nelson Bridwell and Kurt Schaffenberger.

Two more Marvel/DC crossovers, in tabloid format, appeared in 1981: **Batman vs. The Incredible Hulk [DC Special Series #27]** (dated Fall 1981) and **Marvel Treasury Edition #28** (dated 1981) featuring Spider-Man and Superman.

**The Phantom Zone #1-#4** (dated Jan 1982 through Apr 1982), a mini-series by Steve Gerber and Gene Colan, took Superman on an adventure through the Phantom Zone, an immaterial realm which housed many of Krypton’s worst criminals.

Wonder Woman underwent a costume change starting in **Wonder Woman #288** (dated Feb 1982), following a preview in **DC Comics Presents #41** (dated Jan 1982).

Captain Carrot and the Zoo Crew, by Roy Thomas and Scott Shaw, were introduced in a preview in **New Teen Titans** #16 (dated Feb 1982), then continued in **Captain Carrot And His Amazing Zoo Crew** #1 (dated Mar 1982).

Arion, Lord of Atlantis, created and written by Paul Kupperberg, with pencils by Jan Duursema, was introduced in **Warlord** #55 (dated Mar 1982).

The Swamp Thing returned in his own magazine in **Saga Of Swamp Thing** #1 (dated May 1982), by Martin Pasko and Tom Yeates.

**Tales Of The New Teen Titans** #1-#4 (dated June 1982 through Sep 1982), a mini-series by Marv Wolfman and George Pérez, spotlighted four of the team's members.

Firestorm returned to an ongoing series with **The Fury Of Firestorm** #1 (dated June 1982), by Gerry Conway and Pat Broderick.

Baron Winters was introduced in a preview in **The New Teen Titans** #21 (dated July 1982), then continued in his own title, **The Night Force** #1 (dated Aug 1982), by Marv Wolfman and Gene Colan.

After a seven month hiatus, the long-running **Adventure Comics** returned in digest format with issue #491 (dated Sep 1982).

After more than five years, the Blackhawk series resumed publication with **Blackhawk** #251 (dated Oct 1982), by Mark Evanier and Dan Spiegle.

A new Supergirl feature, by Paul Kupperberg and Carmine Infantino, was previewed in **Superman** #376 (dated Oct 1982), then continued with **The Daring New Adventures Of Supergirl** #1 (dated Nov 1982).

The Arion backup feature ended in **Warlord** #62 (dated Oct 1982). The following month, Arion graduated to his own magazine, **Arion, Lord Of Atlantis** #1 (dated Nov 1982), created by Paul Kupperberg and Jan Duursema.

**Camelot 3000** #1-#12 (dated Dec 1982 through Apr 1985), a maxi-series by Mike W. Barr and Brian Bolland, told the tale of the return of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table in modern times.

**DC Comics Presents #52** (dated Dec 1982), by Paul Kupperberg and Keith Giffen, introduced the troublemaking Ambush Bug.

The Great Darkness Saga, begun in **Legion Of Super-Heroes v2 #287**, concluded with a battle between Darkseid and the Legion in issue #294 (dated Dec 1982), by Paul Levitz and Keith Giffen.

Marvel and DC joined forces once more to produce **Marvel And DC Present featuring The Uncanny X-Men and The New Teen Titans #1** (dated 1982), by Chris Claremont and Walter Simonson.

**Wonder Woman #300** (dated Feb 1983), written by Roy and Danette Thomas, introduced Lyta Trevor, the daughter of the Earth-Two Wonder Woman and Steve Trevor, and also revealed the secret origin of the bronze age Sandman. The art on the Lyta Trevor story was by Ross Andru, the art on the Sandman story was by Keith Giffen.

**Batman #357** (dated Mar 1983), by Gerry Conway and Don Newton, introduced Jason Todd, the boy who was destined to replace Dick Grayson as Batman's sidekick, Robin.

The Omega Men were granted their own title, **Omega Men #1** (dated Dec 1982), by Roger Slifer and Keith Giffen.

**The Brave & The Bold #197** (dated Apr 1983), by Alan Brennert and Joe Staton, expanded upon the wedding of the Earth-Two Batman and Catwoman.

**Legion Of Super-Heroes v2 #298** (dated Apr 1983) previewed Amethyst, Princess Of Gemworld, by Dan Mishkin, Gary Cohn, and Ernie Colón. Amethyst then continued in a twelve-issue maxi-series, **Amethyst, Princess Of Gemworld #1-#12** (dated May 1983 through Apr 1984).

Green Arrow was featured in his own magazine, **Green Arrow #1-#4** (dated May 1983 through Aug 1983), a mini-series by Mike Barr and Trevor Von Eeden.

**Omega Men #3** (dated June 1983), by Roger Slifer and Keith Giffen, introduced Lobo, a psychotic interstellar mercenary.

**DC Comics Presents Annual #2** (dated July 1983), by Elliot S! Maggin and Keith Pollard, introduced Superwoman, a descendant of Jimmy Olsen from the 29th century. Superwoman was a creation of Maggin, based on a character he created for his paperback novel, **Superman: Miracle Monday**.



Frank Miller created a martial arts mini-series called **Rönin #1-#4** (dated July 1983 through Jan 1984).

The final issue of **The Brave & The Bold**, #200 (dated July 1983), teamed the Earth-One and Earth-Two Batman in the main story, while the backup story previewed the new Batman and the Outsiders series. The new series, **Batman And The Outsiders #1** (dated Aug 1983), by Mike W. Barr and Jim Aparo, continued the following month.

In **Flash #324** (dated Aug 1983), by Cary Bates and Carmine Infantino, the Flash accidentally killed Professor Zoom while trying to prevent Zoom from murdering his fiancé. The Flash was arrested for murder in the next issue.

The new Vigilante, a character with no ties to the previous western incarnation, was introduced in **The New Teen Titans Annual #2** (dated 1983), by Marv Wolfman, George Pérez, and Pablo Marcos.

**Adventure Comics**, one of DC Comics' longest running titles, was cancelled with issue #503 (dated Sep 1983).

**Superman III Movie Special** (dated 1983) adapted the third Superman movie into comic book form.

**All-Star Squadron #25** (dated Sep 1983), by Roy Thomas and Jerry Ordway, introduced Infinity, Inc., a team consisting of the children and wards of the Justice Society of America.

**Sword Of The Atom #1-#4** (dated Sep 1983 through Dec 1983), a mini-series by Jan Strnad and Gil Kane, took the silver age Atom in a brand new direction.

**The Fury Of Firestorm #17** (dated Oct 1983) introduced Firehawk, by Gerry Conway and Pat Broderick.

The true origin of Black Canary was revealed in **Justice League Of America #219-220** (dated Oct-Nov 1983), in a tale by Roy Thomas, Gerry Conway, and Chuck Patton, based on an idea by Marv Wolfman. The reader learned that the Black Canary who had appeared for years as a member of the Justice League was not the same character that had appeared alongside the Justice Society, but was in reality her daughter.

After appearing in various issue of the **New Teen Titans**, the new Vigilante graduated to his own series, **Vigilante #1** (dated Nov 1983), by Marv Wolfman and Keith Pollard.

DC Comics began expanding into other formats when it started its **DC Graphic Novel** series. The first issue (dated 1983), by Elliot S! Maggin and José Luis Garcia Lopez, featured the Star Raiders, a property of Atari Games.

A new series created by Robert Loren Fleming and Trevor Von Eeden, **Thriller** #1 (dated Nov 1983), began publication in the Summer of 1983.

Jason Todd became Robin for the first time in **Batman** #366 (dated Dec 1983), by Doug Moench and Don Newton.

**Daring New Adventures Of Supergirl** was renamed **Supergirl v2** with issue #14 (dated Dec 1983).

**Atari Force** #1 (dated Jan 1984), by Gerry Conway and José Luis Garcia Lopez, revamped the Atari Games property, which had previously appeared in the miniature comics given away with Atari video games in 1982.

**Saga Of Swamp Thing** was taken over by Alan Moore, with art by Dan Day, with issue #20 (dated Jan 1984). Moore took the series to new levels, emphasizing the horror aspect of the character.

Jason Todd officially became Robin in **Batman** #368 (dated Feb 1984), by Doug Moench and Don Newton.

DC Comics acquired the rights to Paramount's Star Trek property and began publication of a comic book series with **Star Trek** #1 (dated Feb 1984), by Mike W. Barr and Tom Sutton.

After being introduced in **All-Star Squadron**, the children of the Justice Society graduated to their own series, **Infinity, Inc.** #1 (dated Mar 1984), created by Roy Thomas, Jerry Ordway, and Mike Machlan.

**The New Teen Titans** was renamed **Tales Of The Teen Titans** #41 (dated Apr 1984) in preparation of a new publication experiment. The New Teen Titans and the Legion of Super-Heroes would both carry two titles. The newsstand versions would reprint the direct market versions a year after they first appear, similar to the way book publishers handle hardcover and softcover sales.

The Archie Goodwin and Walter Simonson Manhunter backup series from **Detective Comics** was reprinted in **Manhunter** #1 (dated 1984).

The Blue Devil was introduced in **Fury Of Firestorm** #24 (dated June 1984), then continued in his own title, **Blue Devil** #1 (dated June 1984), that same month. The character was created by Gary Cohn, Dan Mishkin, and Paris Cullins.

**New Gods v2** #1-#6 (dated June 1984 through Nov 1984) reprinted the original Jack Kirby New Gods saga, adding a new Kirby story to the conclusion in the final issue.

**Super Powers v1** #1-#5 (dated July 1984 through Nov 1984), a mini-series by Jack Kirby, Joey Cavalieri, and Adrian Gonzales, featured a tale set outside normal DC continuity, adapting the Super Powers television show to comics.

Dick Grayson, who had previously discarded his Robin identity, returned as Nightwing in **Tales Of The Teen Titans** #44 (dated July 1984), by Marv Wolfman and George Pérez. The following month, **The New Teen Titans v2** #1 (dated Aug 1984), the second Titans series by Marv Wolfman and George Pérez, started publication.

**Legion Of Super-Heroes v2** became **Tales Of The Legion** with issue #314 (dated Aug 1984), paving the way for the second Legion title, **Legion Of Super-Heroes v3** #1 (dated Aug 1984), by Paul Levitz and Keith Giffen.

**Jemm, Son Of Saturn** #1-#12 (dated Sep 1984 through Aug 1985), a mini-series by Greg Potter and Gene Colan, introduced Jemm, an alien who looked suspiciously like J'onn J'onzz, the Martian Manhunter.

**Justice League Of America Annual** #2 (dated 1984), by Gerry Conway and Chuck Patton, introduced the new Justice League of America, consisting of the Martian Manhunter, Vixen, Vibe, Steel, and Gypsy.

Due to growing tensions between Earth's Green Lantern and the Guardians of the Universe, Hal Jordan was replaced by John Stewart, the former substitute Green Lantern, in **Green Lantern v2** #182 (dated Nov 1984), by Len Wein and Dave Gibbons.

Amethyst returned in an ongoing series with **Amethyst** #1 (dated Jan 1985), by Dan Mishkin, Gary Cohn, and Ric Estrada.

**America vs. The Justice Society** #1-#4 (dated Jan 1985 through Apr 1985), a mini-series by Roy Thomas and Rafael Kayanan, chronicled a conspiracy which pitted the Justice Society against the United States government.

Wonder Girl married Terry Long in **Tales Of The New Teen Titans** #50 (dated Feb 1985), by Marv Wolfman and George Pérez.

After appearing as a backup feature in the **Warlord** magazine, Conqueror of the Barren Earth graduated to its own mini-series, **Conqueror Of The Barren Earth #1-#4** (dated Feb 1985 through May 1985), created by Gary Cohn and Ron Randall.

**Superman: The Secret Years #1-#4** (dated Feb 1985 through May 1985), a mini-series by Bob Rozakis and Curt Swan, revealed details about Superman's college years.

Supergirl's big screen debut was adapted to comic book form in **Supergirl Movie Special #1** (dated 1985).

**Jonni Thunder #1-#4** (dated Feb 1985 through May 1985), a mini-series by Roy & Dann Thomas and Dick Giordano, introduced Jonni Thunder, a new wielder of the power of the Thunderbolt.

**Funny Stuff Stocking Stuffer #1** (dated Mar 1985), a one-shot magazine, featured just about every funny animal that DC had ever published.

**Who's Who: The Definitive Directory Of The DC Universe #1-#26** (dated Mar 1985 through Apr 1987) was a maxi-series created as part of DC Comics' 50th anniversary celebration. The series was an encyclopedia of most of DC's major heroes, villains, and supporting cast from the past five decades.

At the beginning of 1985, Marv Wolfman and George Pérez began what would turn out to be one of the most important maxi-series ever published, **Crisis On Infinite Earths #1-#12** (dated Apr 1985 through Mar 1986). In a bold move, the publisher had decided to destroy the entire DC Multiverse, replacing it with a single universe which, they hoped, would simplify the long, convoluted history of DC. The idea was to make the books more accessible to new readers, and at the same time allow creators to revamp characters who had been bogged down with years and years of baggage. Unfortunately, a lack of commitment by the company to a total reboot, poor editorial judgment, and piecemeal changes would serve to undermine the foundation set by this series. However, DC's sales did pick up, and a number of its key characters received much needed face lifts, thus the series had served its purpose. In addition to all this, the series was used to introduce characters, previously purchased from Charlton Comics, into the DC Multiverse as heroes on yet another parallel Earth. The first issue introduced one of Charlton's more memorable properties, the Blue Beetle.

**The Shadow War Of Hawkman #1-#4** (dated May 1985 through Aug 1985), a mini-series by Tony Isabella and Richard Howell, introduced new elements into the Hawkman saga which would later be used in his next ongoing series.

The World War II heroes known as the Losers were killed in **Crisis On Infinite Earths** #3 (dated June 1985). The post-Crisis version of their deaths was revealed three months later in **Losers Special** #1 (dated 1985), by Robert Kanigher, Judith Hunt, and Sam Glanzman.

**The Saga Of Swamp Thing v2** #37 (dated June 1985), by Alan Moore and Rick Veitch, introduced John Constantine, a man deeply involved with the occult, into the Swamp Thing mythos.

Ambush Bug was granted his own mini-series with **Ambush Bug** #1-#4 (dated June 1985 through Sep 1985), by Robert Loren Fleming and Keith Giffen.

The 30th century's team of bumbling Legion of Super-Heroes rejects where granted their own one-shot with **Legion Of Substitute Heroes Special** #1 (dated 1985), by Paul Levitz and Keith Giffen.

The Red Tornado received his own mini-series, **Red Tornado** #1-#4 (dated July 1985 through Oct 1985), courtesy of Kurt Busiek and Carmine Infantino.

The western adventures of Jonah Hex ended in **Jonah Hex** #92 (dated Aug 1985), by Michael Fleisher and Gray Morrow. The gunslinger was transported into the post-apocalyptic future of the mid-21st century in **Hex** #1 (dated Sep 1985), by Michael Fleisher and Mark Texeira.

**Crisis On Infinite Earths** #6 (dated Sep 1985) introduced more former Charlton Comics' heroes, like the Blue Beetle before them, into the DC Multiverse. Among these heroes were Captain Atom, Nightshade, the Question, Judomaster, Peacemaker, and Thunderbolt. This issue also introduced the new Wildcat, a replacement for the golden age hero of the same name.

**Super Powers v2** #1-#6 (dated Sep 1985 through Feb 1986), a mini-series by Paul Kupperberg and Jack Kirby, took a second look at the adventures of television's twist on the Justice League, the Super Powers Team.

The first significant fatality of the Crisis, as seen from a business standpoint, took place in **Crisis On Infinite Earths** #7 (dated Oct 1985), where Supergirl was killed battling the Anti-Monitor. This character, believed to have no more commercial value, was sacrificed in preparation of the coming revamp of the Superman legend. Supergirl's sales were never impressive, so DC was probably surprised at the angry letters they received from fans when this issue hit the stands. Regardless of whether one loved or hated Supergirl though, this issue had certainly made a strong impact.

The second major casualty of the Crisis was that of the silver age Flash. After two long years of the drawn out “Trial of the Flash”, his series was finally cancelled. The final issue, **Flash** #350 (dated Oct 1985), ultimately cleared the Flash of murder. After the trial, the Flash was brought to the 30th century, where he learned that his late wife, Iris, was actually alive! It turned out that the parents of Iris, who lived in the 30th century, had transported Iris’ soul out of her body at the moment of her “death” in the 20th century, and transplanted it into the body of a recently dead woman in their own time. The reunion of the two lovers was short, however. In **Crisis On Infinite Earths** #8 (dated Nov 1985), the Flash returned from the 30th century and sacrificed his life to save the Universe. DC claimed that Supergirl and the Flash were chosen for death because both characters had no more potential left. In fact, it was mismanagement, lackluster stories, and inferior art which killed the characters.

The Crisis on Infinite Earths caused a split in the ranks of the Guardians of the Universe and led to one group giving a Green Lantern ring to Guy Gardner, a more arrogant and aggressive individual than is normally chosen for the role. This tale, by Steve Englehart and Joe Staton, took place in **Green Lantern v2** #194 (dated Nov 1985).

**DC Comics Presents** #87 (dated Nov 1985), by Elliot S! Maggin and Curt Swan, introduced the Earth-Prime Superboy, only the second super-powered being known to have originated from that universe.

Like the New Teen Titans and the Legion of Super-Heroes before it, the Outsiders gained a second, direct market series, **The Outsiders** #1 (dated Nov 1985), which presented stories that would be reprinted a year hence in the original newsstand title. Both series were produced by creators Mike W. Barr and Jim Aparo.

**DC Challenge** #1-#12 (dated Nov 1985 through Oct 1986) was an interesting maxi-series set outside of normal DC continuity. Each issue had a different creative team who would end their issue with a cliffhanger that another team would have to resolve.

**Infinity Inc.** #21 (dated Dec 1985), by Roy & Dann Thomas and Todd McFarlane, introduced Dr. Midnight and Hourman, successors to the golden age Dr. Mid-Nite and Hourman.

DC Comics added to its graphic novel line with **DC Science Fiction Graphic Novel** series. The first issue, **DC Science Fiction Graphic Novel** #SF-1 (dated 1985), featured Hell On Earth, based on a tale by Robert Bloch.

In **Crisis On Infinite Earths** #10 (dated Jan 1986), a large group of heroes battled the Anti-Monitor at the dawn of time for the fate of the Multiverse. They failed to stop the Multiverse's destruction, but set in motion the mechanisms necessary for the birth of a new, unified universe in the next issue. Prince Gavyn, the latest Starman, and Aquagirl were both killed in this issue.

Stephen DeStephano and Bob Rozakis created a new, lighthearted series beginning with '**Mazing Man** #1 (dated Jan 1986).

The popular horror movie host, Elvira, Mistress of the Dark, was made the host of a new DC horror title, **Elvira's House Of Mystery** #1 (dated Jan 1986).

The Superman/Batman team-up magazine, **World's Finest Comics v1**, was cancelled with issue #323 (dated Jan 1986).

**The Oz-Wonderland Wars** #1-#3 (dated Jan 1986 through Mar 1986), a mini-series by E. Nelson Bridwell, Joey Cavalieri, and Carol Lay, thrust DC's Captain Carrot and his amazing Zoo Crew into a feud between the characters from L. Frank Baum's Wizard Of Oz and Lewis Carroll's Alice In Wonderland.

A new, unified DC Universe was created in **Crisis On Infinite Earths** #11 (dated Feb 1986), combining aspects of the five parallel universes that had survived up until the end of issue #10.

**Aquaman v2** #1-#4 (dated Feb 1986 through May 1986), a mini-series by Neal Pozner and Craig Hamilton, gave Aquaman a new costume and introduced him to new undersea worlds.

**Wonder Woman** was cancelled with #329 (dated Feb 1986). This issue, by Gerry Conway and Don Heck, presented the long overdue wedding of the Earth-One Wonder Woman and Steve Trevor.

**Legionnaires Three** #1-#4 (dated Feb 1986 through May 1986), by Keith Giffen, Mindy Newell, and Ernie Colón, pitted the founding members of the Legion of Super-Heroes against the might of the one, true Time Trapper.

Booster Gold, the first character unique to the new DC Universe, was introduced in **Booster Gold** #1 (dated Feb 1986), by Dan Jurgens. This hero, whose prime motivation was greed, escaped from the 25th century to set up shop in Superman's Metropolis.

**Crisis On Infinite Earths #12** (dated Mar 1986), the final issue of the universe shattering maxi-series, chronicled the defeat of the Anti-Monitor. Many more heroes died or faded before the battle ended. Among these were Dove, Kole, Lori Lemaris, Sunburst, the Huntress, and the Earth-Two Robin. The Earth-One Wonder Woman was reduced to clay in this issue, setting the stage for the creation of the post-Crisis Wonder Woman. Kid Flash took up the mantle of his mentor and became the new Flash. And another Charlton hero, Son of Vulcan, was introduced.

**Hawkman Special #1** (dated 1986), by Tony Isabella and Richard Howell, was a one-shot which continued the storyline begun in **The Shadow War The Hawkman** mini-series. The story then continued into a new ongoing series with **Hawkman v2 #1** (dated Aug 1986), also by Tony Isabella and Richard Howell.

**Saga Of Swamp Thing** was renamed **Swamp Thing v2** with issue #46 (dated Mar 1986).

Deadman returned in a new mini-series, **Deadman v2 #1-#4** (dated Mar 1986 through June 1986), by Andrew Helfer and José Luis Garcia Lopez.

After the DC Universe was reborn, **Secret Origins v2** was added to the publishing roster in order to present post-Crisis origins for DC's heroes and villains. The first few issues, however, were used for tributes. Issue #1 (dated Apr 1986), for instance, featured the origin of the golden age Superman, in a tale by Roy Thomas and Wayne Boring.

**The Shadow v2 #1-#4** (dated May 1986 through Aug 1986), a mini-series by Howard Chaykin, presented a new interpretation of the classic Shadow character.

**Legend Of Wonder Woman #1-#4** (dated May 1986 through Aug 1986), a mini-series by Kurt Busiek and Trina Robbins, presented the final story of the pre-Crisis Wonder Woman. It is unclear what the purpose was behind producing a mini-series which looked back at a time when the rest of the company was looking forward.

**Batman And The Outsiders** was renamed **The Adventures Of The Outsiders** with issue #33 (dated May 1986). Reprints would begin with issue #39.

**Blue Beetle #1** (dated June 1986), by Len Wein and Paris Cullins, began the first ongoing series produced by DC to feature a Charlton hero.

**Batman: The Dark Knight #1-#4** (dated 1986), a prestige format mini-series by Frank Miller, presented a glimpse into the future where an aged and battle-scarred Bruce Wayne returned to the streets of Gotham as the Batman.



**Son Of Ambush Bug** #1-#6 (dated July 1986 through Dec 1986), by Keith Giffen and Robert Loren Fleming, followed up on the successful **Ambush Bug** mini-series.

**Last Days Of The Justice Society Special** #1 (dated 1986), a one-shot by Roy Thomas and David Ross, trapped the Justice Society in another dimension, where they were condemned to battle the demon Surtur for the rest of eternity so that the universe could live.

Lois Lane was granted her own two-issue mini-series, **Lois Lane** #1-#2 (dated Aug and Sep 1986), by Mindy Newell and Gray Morrow.

**Heroes Against Hunger** #1 (dated 1986) was a one-shot published by DC to raise money to help battle the problem of world hunger.

**Teen Titans Spotlight** #1 (dated Aug 1986) began a series intended to feature solo stories of New Teen Titans members and their supporting cast. The first issue, by Marv Wolfman and Denys Cowan, featured Starfire.

Bucking the superhero trend, a romance mini-series, **Angel Love** #1-#8 (dated Aug 1986 through Mar 1987), was presented in 1986, and was followed closely by a one-shot special in 1987.

The third and final Super Powers title, **Super Powers v3** #1-#4 (dated Sep 1986 through Dec 1986), appeared in 1986. This mini-series, by Paul Kupperberg and Carmine Infantino, introduced into comic books the hero called Samurai, featured for years on television's Super Friends and Super Powers cartoons.

**Watchmen** #1-#12 (dated Sep 1986 through Oct 1987), a twelve-issue maxi-series by Alan Moore and Dave Gibbons, took comic books to the next level. This series took a realistic look at what the world would really be like if populated by superheroes and super-villains.

**Superman** #423 (dated Sep 1986) and **Action Comics** #583 (Sep 1986), by Alan Moore, Curt Swan, and George Pérez, presented the last Earth-One Superman story. These two issues showed the true potential of the silver age Superman mythos if handled correctly, however the decision had already been made to restart Superman's saga with a clean slate. Both series suspend publication for a few months in order to set the stage for the new, updated Superman.

Although the post-Crisis Superman was introduced, of all places, in **Booster Gold** #6-#7 (dated July and Aug 1986), the hero's revamped origins weren't presented until John Byrne's semi-monthly mini-series, **The Man Of Steel** #1-#6 (dated 1986). One key difference between the old and new Superman was the elimination of all of the silver age Superman's Kryptonian baggage. He was now the sole survivor of the doomed planet, as originally intended. No more Phantom Zone. No more bottled city of Kandor. No more Supergirl, Super-Dog, or Super-Monkey. No more abundant, multi-colored forms of kryptonite. Even Superboy was removed from the Superman mythos, as it was established that this Superman had begun his career as an adult. This last change would have serious implications for the team that was founded on the history of Superboy, the Legion of Super-Heroes.

In **Infinity Inc.** #31 (dated Oct 1986), by Roy & Dann Thomas and Todd McFarlane, the Star-Spangled Kid, a hero whose career began forty-five years earlier, was renamed Skyman.

**Legends** #1-#6 (dated Nov 1986 through Apr 1987), a mini-series by John Ostrander, Len Wein, and John Byrne, revamped a number of DC's characters. For instance, issue #1 introduced the post-Crisis Captain Marvel.

**Green Lantern v2** was renamed **The Green Lantern Corps** with issue #206 (dated Nov 1986), and focused on a small band of Green Lanterns who had decided to remain on Earth following the Crisis.

One of the Legion of Super-Heroes' founders, Cosmic Boy, took a trip to the 20th century in **Cosmic Boy** #1-#4 (dated Dec 1986 through Mar 1987), a mini-series by Paul Levitz, Keith Giffen, and Ernie Colón. He was shocked to learn that much of what the 30th century knew of the 20th was wrong. The Legionnaires would soon learn that their whole existence was based on a lie.

**History Of The DC Universe** #1-#2 (dated 1986), a two-issue prestige format mini-series by Marv Wolfman and George Pérez, laid down the foundation for the post-Crisis DC Universe.

**Action Comics** resumed publication after four months with issue #584 (dated Jan 1987). **Superman** returned also, with issue #424 (dated Jan 1987), having been renamed **The Adventures Of Superman**. A new series, John Byrne's **Superman v2** #1 (dated Jan 1987), was the third and final Superman title to appear that month.

**The Demon v2** #1-#4 (dated Jan 1987 through Apr 1987), a mini-series by Matt Wagner, chronicled the latest exploits of the demon Etrigan.

The new Suicide Squad was introduced in **Legends #3** (dated Jan 1987), by John Ostrander, Len Wein, and John Byrne.

The post-Crisis origin of Batman was presented by Frank Miller and David Mazzuchelli's in *Batman: Year One*, a four-part story arc that appeared in **Batman #404-#407** (dated Feb 1987 through May 1987).

The post-Crisis Wonder Woman was introduced in **Wonder Woman v2 #1** (dated Feb 1987), by Greg Potter and George Pérez. This latest incarnation of Wonder Woman arrived in *Man's World* in the current day, necessitating some alterations to the history of the Justice League, and played up the Greek mythology that was always part of the heroine's legacy.

The second Charlton hero to gain his own series was the Question, with **The Question #1** (dated Feb 1987) by Denny O'Neil and Denys Cowan. The following month, another Charlton hero was granted his own title, **Captain Atom #1** (dated Mar 1987), by Cary Bates and Pat Broderick.

**Secret Origins v2 #12** (dated Mar 1987) introduced the golden age Fury, a character designed by Michael Bair, in a tale by Roy & Dann Thomas and Tom Grindberg. This character, whose exploits were set during World War II, would next be seen three months later as a member of the Young All-Stars.

The Justice League of America was all but disbanded at the end of **Justice League Of America #261** (dated Apr 1987), the final issue of that series. A new Justice League was formed in **Legends #6** (dated Apr 1987), by John Ostrander, Len Wein, and John Byrne.

The updated history of Captain Marvel was presented in the mini-series **Shazam: The New Beginning #1-#4** (dated Apr 1987 through July 1987), by Roy & Dann Thomas and Tom Mandrake. The origin presented here would later be ignored and replaced by a different origin story, a practice that unfortunately became commonplace following the Crisis.

The Spectre returned to his own series with **The Spectre v2 #1** (dated Apr 1987), by Doug Moench and Gene Colan.

Following their introduction in the **Legends** mini-series, the Suicide Squad graduated to their own series, **Suicide Squad #1** (dated May 1987) by John Ostrander and Luke McDonnell.

Another team introduced in the **Legends** mini-series, the new Justice League, continued their adventures with **Justice League #1** (dated May 1987), by Keith Giffen, J.M. DeMatteis, and Kevin Maguire.

Following the sacrifice of the silver age Flash during the Crisis, his former sidekick, Kid Flash, had taken up the mantle of his fallen mentor. The new Flash gained his own title with **Flash v2 #1** (dated June 1987), by Mike Baron and Jackson Guice.

**Young All-Stars #1** (dated June 1987) by Roy and Dann Thomas, Michael Bair, and Brian Murray, introduced Iron Munro and Flying Fox. They, along with the golden age Fury, were intended to fill the void left by the elimination of the golden age Superman, Batman, and Wonder Woman following the Crisis. It would later be established that an obscure Quality Comics heroine, named Miss America, would also be used to fill in some of the gaps left by Wonder Woman's removal from the history of the Justice Society.

**Batman #408-#411** (dated June 1987 through Sep 1987), by Max Collins and Chris Warner, presented the post-Crisis origin of Jason Todd, the second Robin. This change was but one example of a creative team mucking around with a character's history, with no regard for the impact on other characters or titles. This revision was hardly an improvement, and certainly was not necessary.

**Detective Comics #575-#578** (dated June 1987 through Sep 1987) presented the Batman: Year Two story arc, by Mike W. Barr and Alan Davis.

The Heroes of Angor, last seen in **Justice League Of America #87**, returned in **Justice League #2** (dated June 1987), in a tale by Keith Giffen, J.M. DeMatteis, and Kevin Maguire.

**Doctor Fate #1-#4** (dated July 1987 through Oct 1987), by J.M. DeMatteis and Keith Giffen, introduced the new Doctor Fate, a ten year-old named Eric Strauss who was suddenly accelerated to adulthood. In the fourth issue, Eric merged with his stepmother, Linda, to form the final Doctor Fate.

The Shadow return to an ongoing monthly with **The Shadow v3 #1** (dated Aug 1987), by Andrew Helfer and Bill Sienkiewicz.

Mike Grell revamped Green Arrow, dumping the trick arrows and playing up the archery aspect, in **Green Arrow: The Long Bow Hunters #1-#3** (dated 1987).

Max Collins and Terry Beatty introduced their creation, Wild Dog, in **Wild Dog #1-#4** (dated Sep 1987 through Dec 1987).

The new Doom Patrol returned in their own series in **Doom Patrol v2 #1** (dated Oct 1987), by Paul Kupperberg and Steve Lightle.

The Phantom Stranger was granted his own mini-series, **The Phantom Stranger v3 #1-#4** (dated Oct 1987 through Jan 1988), by Paul Kupperberg and Mike Mignola.

**Superman IV Movie Special #1** (dated 1987), adapted the fourth and final Superman movie into comic book form.

**Firestorm Annual #5** (dated 1987) introduced the second incarnation of Firestorm, in a story by John Ostrander and Joe Brozowski. The **Fury Of Firestorm** title was renamed **Firestorm, The Nuclear Man** with #65 (dated Nov 1987), continuing the adventures of the new Firestorm.

**Justice League** was renamed **Justice League International** with #7 (dated Nov 1987), after the Justice League took their operations worldwide.

The Princess of Gemworld returned in a four-issue mini-series, **Amethyst v2 #1-#4** (dated Nov 1987 through Feb 1988), by Keith Giffen, Mindy Newell, and Esteban Maroto.

Doc Savage, another Conde Nast property, was given his own mini-series, **Doc Savage #1-#4** (dated Nov 1987 through Feb 1988), by Dennis O'Neil and Adam and Andy Kubert.

**World Of Krypton v2 #1-#4** (dated Dec 1987 through Mar 1988), a mini-series by John Byrne, Mike Mignola, and Rick Bryant, gave the reader some background on the Krypton of the new DC Universe.

**Batman: Son Of The Demon** (dated 1987), a hardcover graphic novel by Mike W. Barr and Jerry Bingham, chronicles a battle between Batman and his enemy Ra's al Ghul, and hints that Batman may have had a son through his enemy's daughter, Talia.

**Sonic Disrupters #1** (dated Dec 1987), a twelve-issue maxi-series by Mike Baron and Barry Crain, became the first DC mini-series ever to be cancelled before completion. The series ended with issue #7.

A weekly mini-series, **Millennium #1-#8** (dated 1987) by Steve Englehart and Joe Staton, saw the defeat of the android Manhunters and the creation of a new breed of immortals called the Chosen.

John Constantine, a supporting character in the **Swamp Thing** series, graduated to his own magazine with **Hellblazer #1** (dated Jan 1988), by Jamie Delano and John Ridgway.

**Peacemaker #1-#4** (dated Jan 1988 through Apr 1988), a mini-series by Paul Kupperberg and Tod Smith, starred yet another Charlton character.

**Star Trek: The Next Generation #1-#6** (dated Feb 1988 through July 1988), a mini-series by Mike Carlin and Pablo Marcos, chronicled the adventures of Captain Jean Luc Picard and the crew of the Enterprise.

After accidentally killing an innocent, the gun-wielding Vigilante commits suicide in **Vigilante #50** (dated Feb 1988), by Paul Kupperberg and Steve Erwin.

The Fourth World's teen gods return in **Forever People v2 #1-#6** (dated Feb 1988 through July 1988), a mini-series by J.M. DeMatteis and Paris Cullins.

Green Arrow graduated to his own ongoing title with **Green Arrow v2 #1** (dated Feb 1988), by Mike Grell and Gray Ed Hannigan.

The **Greatest ... Stories Ever Told** series of paperback books began publication in 1988, starting with **Greatest Superman Stories Ever Told**.

Blackhawk and his crew are completely revamped by Howard Chaykin in **Blackhawk v2 #1-#3** (dated Mar 1988 through May 1988).

**Action Comics #598** (dated Mar 1988) introduced the government agency known as Checkmate, in a story by John Byrne. The following month, the team graduated to their own title, **Checkmate #1** (dated Apr 1988), by Paul Kupperberg and Steve Erwin.

The Justice League encountered a bizarre entity called the Weird in **The Weird #1-#4** (dated Apr 1988 through July 1988), a mini-series created and written by Jim Starlin, with pencils by Berni Wrightson.

**Who's Who In The Legion Of Super-Heroes #1-#7** (dated Apr 1988 through Nov 1988) compiled the rich history of the Legion into a concise encyclopedia, updating certain entries to reflect changes caused by the Crisis.

**World Of Smallville #1-#4** (dated Apr 1988 through July 1988), a mini-series by John Byrne and Kurt Schaffenberger, covered post-Crisis life in Superman's childhood hometown of Smallville.

The Bonus Book program, which added a free insert into one DC Comic per month, began in **Action Comics #599** (dated Apr 1988). The modern day Little Boy Blue and the Blue Boys were introduced in the second Bonus Book insert in **Flash v2 #12** (dated May 1988), by George Broderick Jr. and Gordon Purcell.

**Martian Manhunter #1-#4** (dated May 1988 through Aug 1988), a mini-series by J.M. DeMatteis and Mark Badger, revamped the origin and history of J'onn J'onzz, the Martian Manhunter.

DC acquired the rights from King Features to publish **The Phantom #1-#4** (dated May 1988 through Aug 1988), a mini-series by Peter David and Joe Orlando.

**History Of The DC Universe** (dated 1988), collected the two-issue prestige mini-series into a limited hardcover, adding material that didn't appear in the original.

One of DC Comics' earliest heroes was granted his own mini-series with **The Crimson Avenger #1-#4** (dated June 1988 through Sep 1988), by Roy & Dann Thomas and Greg Brooks.

**Power Girl #1-#4** (dated June 1988 through Sep 1988), a mini-series by Paul Kupperberg and Rick Hoberg, chronicled the adventures of the revamped Power Girl.

The Wanderers, a super-team active in the Legion's 30th century, gained their own title, **Wanderers #1** (dated June 1988), by Doug Moench and Dave Hoover.

**Aquaman Special v1 #1** (dated 1988), by Dan Mishkin, Gary Cohn, and George Freeman, continued the chronicles of the revamped post-Crisis Aquaman.

Another King Features property was licensed by DC Comics, appearing in **Flash Gordon #1-#9** (dated June 1988 through Holiday 1988), a mini-series by Dan Jurgens.

A repentant Mark Shaw returned to his role as the Manhunter in **Manhunter #1** (dated July 1988), by John Ostrander, Kim Yale, and Doug Rice.

**Batgirl Special #1** (dated 1988), a one-shot by Barbara Randall and Barry Kitson, chronicled the final adventure of Batgirl.

In **Batman: The Killing Joke** (dated 1988), by Alan Moore and Brian Bolland, the Joker breaks the spine of Batgirl, leaving her a cripple.

**Action Comics** increased its page count, went to a weekly publication schedule, and was renamed **Action Comics Weekly** with issue #601 (dated 1988). That issue introduced the new Secret Six, by Martin Pasko and Dan Spiegle, a new team gathered together by the mysterious Mockingbird.

The Atom returned in his own ongoing monthly, **The Power Of The Atom #1** (dated Aug 1988) by Roger Stern and Dwayne Turner.

**World Of Metropolis #1-#4** (dated Aug 1988 through Nov 1988), by John Byrne and Win Mortimer, expanded the readers' knowledge of the post-Crisis city of Metropolis.

**Superman v2 Annual #2** (dated 1988) introduced the post-Crisis versions of the Guardian and the Newsboy Legion, by Roger Stern and Ron Frenz.

**Animal Man #1** (dated Sep 1988), by Grant Morrison and Chas Truog, took an obscure hero with animal powers and completely revamped and fleshed out the character.

The Chosen, gathered during the **Millennium** mini-series, graduated to their own magazine, **The New Guardians #1** (dated Sep 1988), by Steve Englehart and Joe Staton.

**Starman #1** (dated Oct 1988), created by Roger Stern and Tom Lyle, introduced the latest Starman, Will Payton.

**Hawk And Dove v2 #1-#5** (dated Oct 1988 through Holiday 1988), a mini-series by Karl & Barbara Kesel and Rob Liefeld, introduced the new, female Dove to replace Hawk's fallen brother.

**Plastic Man v2 #1-#4** (dated Nov 1988 through Feb 1989), a mini-series by Phil Foglio and Hilary Barta, updated the origin of Plastic Man and his pal, Woozy Winks.

**Deadshot #1-#4** (dated Nov 1988 through Holiday 1988), a mini-series by John Ostrander, Kim Yale, and Luke McDonnell, featured a former Batman foe who had gained popularity as a member of the Suicide Squad.

Following the success of his mini-series, Doc Savage returned in his own ongoing monthly with **Doc Savage v2 #1** (dated Nov 1988), by Denny O'Neil and Rod Wingham.



**Cosmic Odyssey #1-#4** (dated 1988), a mini-series by Jim Starlin and Mike Mignola, pitted heroes of Earth against the evil Darkseid, ruler of Apokolips. John Stewart, one of Earth's Green Lanterns, ultimately failed in his mission, causing the death of an entire planet.

By 1988, the Teen Titans were clearly being depicted as having entered into their early twenties, thus **The New Teen Titans v2** was renamed **The New Titans** with issue #50 (dated Dec 1988).

Following a successful mini-series, the new Doctor Fate returned in his own ongoing title, **Doctor Fate v2 #1** (dated Winter 1988) by J.M. DeMatteis and Shawn McManus.

The Unknown Soldier returned in **Unknown Soldier v2 #1-#12** (dated Winter 1988 through Dec 1989), a mini-series by James Owsley and Phil Gascoine.

Aware that Jason Todd, the second Robin, wasn't the most popular of characters, the creators of the Batman titles decided to leave his fate in the hands of the fans. A phone poll would be used to determine whether the character lived or died. The vote was close: 5343 to 5271 ... against. Robin was killed by the Joker in **Batman #428** (dated "Holiday" 1988). This story arc was by Jim Starlin and Jim Aparo.

The major alien powers of this galaxy and others formed an alliance to invade Earth in **Invasion #1-#3** (dated 1988 through 1989), a mini-series by Keith Giffen, Bill Mantlo, and Todd McFarlane.

The mysterious Black Orchid returned in a prestige format mini-series, **Black Orchid #1-#3** (dated 1988 through 1989), by Neil Gaiman and Dave McKean.

**Christmas With The Super-Heroes #1** (dated 1988), contained reprints of Christmas stories involving DC's heroes.

Neil Gaiman, Sam Kieth, and Mike Dringenberg created a brand new Sandman in **Sandman v2 #1** (dated Jan 1989). This version was Morpheus, god of dreams, one of eternal beings who made up the Endless.

Mister Miracle return to an ongoing series with **Mister Miracle v2 #1** (dated Jan 1989), by J.M. DeMatteis and Ian Gibson.

**L.E.G.I.O.N. '89 #1** (dated Feb 1989), by Keith Giffen, Alan Grant, and Barry Kitson, introduced a new interstellar law enforcement group called L.E.G.I.O.N., led by Vril Dox II. This series grew out of events begun in the **Invasion!** mini-series.

**Action Comics Weekly #636** (dated 1/24/89) introduced the new Phantom Lady, by Len Strazewski and Chuck Austen.

**Action Comics Weekly #637** (1/31/89) introduced Bob Rozakis and Stephen DeStefano's Hero Hotline, a group of superheroes that were just a phone call away. The heroes were led by the mysterious Coordinator (who was in reality the golden age hero called the Americommando).

**Catwoman #1-#4** (dated Feb 1989 through May 1989), a mini-series by Mindy Newell and J. J. Birch, chronicled the adventures of one of the Batman's most elusive and sexy foes.

Grant Morrison and Richard Case took over **Doom Patrol v2** with issue #19 (dated Feb 1989). They departed from superhero based stories, moving instead towards the bizarre.

The New Gods returned to monthly publication with **New Gods v3 #1** (dated Feb 1989), by Mark Evanier and Paris Cullins.

**Firestorm, The Nuclear Man #83-#85** (dated Mar 1989 through May 1989), by John Ostrander and Tom Grindberg, introduced the third incarnation of Firestorm, one with a drastically different look.

Following the success of his mini-series, Blackhawk was given his own ongoing series with **Blackhawk v3 #1** (dated Mar 1989), by Martin Pasko and Rick Burchett.

The Phantom was granted his own ongoing, **The Phantom v2 #1** (dated Mar 1989) by Mark Verheiden and Luke McDonnell, after the success of his earlier mini-series.

The Shadow returned in a hardcover graphic novel, **Private Files Of The Shadow** (dated 1989), which included a number of O'Neil/Kaluta reprints and one Mike Kaluta original story.

Hero Hotline graduated from **Action Comics Weekly** into their own mini-series, **Hero Hotline #1-#6** (dated Apr 1989 through Sep 1989), created by Bob Rozakis and Stephen DeStefano.

The post-Crisis Huntress was introduced in **Huntress #1** (dated Apr 1989), by Joey Cavalieri and Joe Staton.

Justice League International split into two groups, one stationed in America, one in Europe. **Justice League Europe** #1 (dated Apr 1989), by Keith Giffen, J.M. DeMatteis, Bart Sears, followed events in **Justice League International** #24. **Justice League International** was renamed **Justice League America** with issue #26 (dated May 1989).

The revised Aquaman appeared once again in **Aquaman Special v2** #1 (dated 1989), by Keith Giffen, Robert Loren Fleming, and Curt Swan.

Wonder Girl was renamed Troia in **The New Titans** #55 (dated June 1989), in a tale by Marv Wolfman and George Pérez.

**Secret Origins v2 Annual** #3 (dated 1989), by George Pérez, Kevin Maguire, and Mark Bright, introduced Flamebird, the post-Crisis equivalent of the original Bat-Girl.

Hawk and Dove returned in a new ongoing title with **Hawk And Dove v3** #1 (dated June 1989), by Karl & Barbara Kesel and Greg Guler.

**Aquaman v3** #1-#5 (dated June 1989 through Oct 1989), a mini-series by Keith Giffen, Robert Loren Fleming, and Curt Swan, continued the exploits of the post-Crisis Aquaman.

**Action Comics Weekly** returned to its normal format and frequency, and was renamed **Action Comics**, with issue #643 (dated July 1989).

Batman: Year Three, a story arc relating the post-Crisis origin of the first Robin, appeared in **Batman** #436-#439 (dated “Early Aug” 1989 through “late Sep” 1989), by Marv Wolfman and Pat Broderick.

The first Batman movie was adapted into comic book form in **Batman: The Official Comic Adaptation Of The Warner Bros. Motion Picture** (dated 1989).

The origin of Hawkman and Hawkwoman was completely revised in **Hawkworld** #1-#3 (dated 1989), a prestige format mini-series by Timothy Truman.

**El Diablo** #1 (dated Aug 1989), by Gerard Jones and Mike Parobeck, introduced a new, modern-day El Diablo.

**Swamp Thing v2 Annual** #5 (dated 1989), featured the return of Brother Power the Geek, by Neil Gaiman, Richard Piers Rayner, and Mike Hoffman.

**The Shadow Strikes #1** (dated Sep 1989), by Gerard Jones and Eduardo Barreto, continued the adventures of the mysterious pulp hero known as the Shadow.

The Avenger returned in a new mini-series, **Justice, Inc. v2 #1-#2** (dated 1989) by Andrew Helfer and Kyle Baker.

Both versions of the U.S.S. Enterprise returned in their own ongoing monthlies with **Star Trek v2 #1** (dated Oct 1989), by Peter David and James W. Fry, and **Star Trek: The Next Generation v2 #1** (dated Oct 1989), by Michael Jan Friedman and Pablo Marcos.

A new title was added to the Batman line with **Legends Of The Dark Knight #1** (dated Nov 1989). The first story arc of this new series was by Denny O'Neil and Edward Hannigan.

When Paul Levitz, who had written the adventures of the Legion of Super-Heroes for over a decade, decided to leave the title, co-creator Keith Giffen decided to make a clean break when he took over the feature. The Legion title was cancelled, and returned three months later with **Legion Of Super-Heroes v4 #1** (dated Nov 1989), by Keith Giffen, Al Gordon, and Tom & Mary Bierbaum. The new series was set five years after the previous series, and featured a much darker, more pessimistic tone.

The origin of the Green Lantern was revised in **Green Lantern: Emerald Dawn #1-#6** (dated Dec 1989 through May 1990), a mini-series begun by Jim Owsley and M.D. Bright, and who were joined in the second issue by Keith Giffen and Gerard Jones.

**Batman #442** (dated "Dec" 1989), by Marv Wolfman, George Pérez, and Jim Aparo, depicted for the first time the young Tim Drake in a Robin costume.

**Christmas With The Super-Heroes #2** (dated 1989) presented all-new material for the holiday season.

The Archives hardcover reprint series started in 1989 with the publication of **Superman Archives #1** (dated 1989).

**Deadman: Love After Death #1-#2** (dated 1989), a prestige format mini-series by Mike Baron and Kelley Jones, brought back Boston Brand with a new, eerier look.

Pressures from the editors of the Superman titles, which had eliminated Superboy from the Superman mythos, insisted that character be completely removed from the Legion's history. Thus, the 30th century universe was destroyed in **Legion Of Super-Heroes v4 #4** (dated Feb 1990).

**Time Masters** #1-#8 (dated Feb 1990 through Sep 1990), by Bob Wayne, Lewis Shiner, and Art Thibert, introduced the post-Crisis Rip Hunter into the DC Universe. This mini-series was supposed to redefine time travel in the DCU however, like most of the tales following the Crisis, little attention was paid to the new rules, and the restrictions slowly were ignored.

A new Superboy series, **Superboy v2** #1 (dated Feb 1990), based on the Superboy television series, was added to the line-up, in part to retain trademark on the Superboy name.

**The Atlantis Chronicles** #1-#7 (dated Mar 1990 through Sep 1990), a mini-series by Peter David and Esteban Maroto, presented the new, post-Crisis history of the kingdom of Atlantis. New elements were added to the Aquaman mythos, which would be picked up upon in future appearances.

**Adam Strange** #1-#3 (dated 1990), a prestige format mini-series by Richard Bruning and Andy Kubert, presented the birth of Adam's daughter and the apparent death of his wife.

A new 30th century was formed in **Legion Of Super-Heroes v4** #6 (dated Apr 1990) by the evil time-witch Glorith, wherein it was a hero named Valor, and not Superboy, who inspired the formation of the Legion.

John Butcher was introduced in **The Butcher** #1-#5 (dated May 1990 through Sep 1990), a mini-series created by Mike Baron and Shea Anton Pensa.

The revised Green Lantern returned in his own ongoing monthly, **Green Lantern v3** #1 (dated June 1990), by Gerard Jones and Pat Broderick.

Following the success of his mini-series, Hawkman returned in an ongoing title, **Hawkworld v2** #1 (dated June 1990) by John Ostrander, Timothy Truman, and Graham Nolan. Unfortunately, the poorly thought out decision was made to place Hawkman's arrival on Earth in the present day, nullifying a number of post-Crisis stories involving Hawkman, and causing numerous continuity errors in the years to come.

DC Comics, who was now owned by Warner Communications, made use of characters from its sister company, Warner Bros., and presented **Bugs Bunny** #1-#3 (dated June 1990 through Sep 1990).

**Shade, The Changing Man v2 #1** (dated July 1990), by Peter Milligan and Chris Bachalo, completely rewrote the history of Shade, aiming the series at a more mature audience. Too bad the original Shade had just appeared a short time before as a member of the Suicide Squad. Yet another example of a series which had no regard for other works which were produced by other creators in the wake of the Crisis.

Etrigan the Demon was granted a new ongoing title with **The Demon v3 #1** (dated July 1990), by Alan Grant and Val Semeiks.

Mark Waid and Mike Parobeck introduced John Fox, the future Flash, in **Flash Special #1** (dated 1990).

**World's Finest v2 #1-#3** (dated 1990), a prestige format mini-series by Dave Gibbons and Steve Rude, reunited the team of Superman and Batman.

The ultra-violent mercenary, Lobo, was given his first mini-series, **Lobo #1-#4** (dated Nov 1990 through Feb 1991), by Keith Giffen, Alan Grant, and Simon Bisley.

An event occurred in **Superman v2 #50** (dated Dec 1990) which most thought would never happen. After more than fifty years, Clark Kent finally proposed to the love of his life, Lois Lane. This story was presented by Jerry Ordway and various artists.

Tim Drake officially became the third Robin in **Batman #457** (dated Dec 1990), by Alan Grant and Norm Breyfogle.

The Justice League franchise expanded with the coming of **Justice League Quarterly #1** (Winter 1990).

The new Robin was granted his first mini-series with **Robin #1-#5** (dated Jan 1991 through May 1991), by Chuck Dixon and Tom Lyle.

**Justice League America #46** (dated Jan 1991) introduced General Glory, a World War II continuity implant created by J.M. DeMatteis and Keith Giffen.

The nature of magic was explored in **Books Of Magic #1-#4** (dated 1990 through 1991), a prestige format mini-series written by Neil Gaiman. This series also introduced young Tim Hunter, an emerging sorcerer who could just as likely go over to the dark side as to the light.

Although he had already proposed to Lois Lane two months earlier, Clark Kent waited to reveal his secret identity to her, as seen in **Action Comics #662** (dated Feb 1991) by Roger Stern and Bob McLeod.

A second Batman hardcover graphic novel, **Batman: Bride Of The Demon** (dated 1990), by Mike W. Barr and Tom Grindberg, appeared in late 1990.

The Challengers returned in a four-issue mini-series, **Challengers Of The Unknown v2 #1-#8** (dated Mar 1991 through Oct 1991), by Jeph Loeb and Tim Sale.

**Angel And The Ape v2 #1-#4** (dated Mar 1991 through June 1991), a mini-series by Phil Foglio, was full of revelations. The reader learned the secret origin of Sam Simeon, the link between Angel O'Day and Dumb Bunny of the Inferior Five, and the secret of the Green Glob.

The Justice Society was featured in their own mini-series, **Justice Society Of America #1-#8** (dated Apr 1991 through Nov 1991), by Len Strazewski and Rick Burchett.

More of the early history of the post-Crisis Green Lantern was revealed in **Emerald Dawn II #1-#6** (dated Apr 1991 through Sep 1991), by Keith Giffen, Gerard Jones, and M.D. Bright.

**Kid Eternity #1-#3** (dated 1991), a prestige format mini-series by Grant Morrison and Duncan Fegredo, revised the origin of the World War II hero, gearing the series to a more mature readership.

**Armageddon 2001 #1** (dated May 1991), by Archie Goodwin and Dan Jurgens, was the first of two-issues which introduced Waverider and the menace of Monarch. Waverider had traveled back from the future to prevent the rise of the future tyrant and the slaughter of the superheroes in 2001. Waverider knew that Monarch was originally one of the superheroes before being corrupted, and thus set out to read the futures of all the present era's heroes. After crossing through the Summer's annuals, the story concluded in issue #2.

**Twilight #1-#3** (dated 1990 through 1991), a prestige format mini-series by Howard Chaykin and José Luis Garcia Lopez, made use of DC's heroes of the future to spin a tale which revolved around the corruption of Tommy Tomorrow and the search for immortality.

**Mister E #1-#4** (dated June 1991 through Sep 1991), a mini-series by K.W. Jeter and John K. Snyder, continued a storyline begun in the **Books Of Magic** mini-series.

Superman gained a third title, **Superman: The Man Of Steel #1** (dated July 1991), written by Louise Simonson, with pencils by Bogdanove, Grummett, McLeod, and Jurgens.

The one-time enemy of the New Teen Titans, Deathstroke, gained his own ongoing series, **Deathstroke: The Terminator #1** (dated Aug 1991), by Marv Wolfman and Steve Erwin.

**Superboy v2**, the title based on the television series, was renamed **The Adventures Of Superboy** with issue #19 (dated Aug 1991).

**War Of The Gods #1-#4** (dated Sep 1991 through Dec 1991), a mini-series by George Pérez and various artists, chronicled the war between the various pantheons of the DC Universe. The series featured the secret origin of Shazam, as well as the deaths of Son Of Vulcan (also called Halciber Filius) and the Greek god Hermes.

Team Titans, a group of heroes from the near future, escaped into the past to prevent the rise of the evil Lord Chaos, as seen in **The New Titans #79** (dated Sep 1991), **New Titans Annual #7** (dated 1991), and **The New Titans #80** (dated Nov 1991). The teen heroes, created by Marv Wolfman, would later be linked to the tyrant called Monarch.

**Flash TV Special #1** (dated 1991) adapted the Flash television series to comic book format.

The Ragman returned with a revised origin in **Ragman v2 #1-#8** (dated Oct 1991 through May 1992), a mini-series by Keith Giffen, Robert Loren Fleming, and Pat Broderick.

**Armageddon 2001 #2** (dated Oct 1991), by Denny O'Neil and Dan Jurgens, concluded the Summer crossover, but cheated the reader by changing the identity of the corrupted hero at the last minute. The readers had figured out that it was Captain Atom who would become Monarch, so DC decided to change the ending to make Hawk the villain instead. The final story had the future Monarch kill Dove, driving Hawk insane. Hawk in turn killed Monarch, taking his armor, and vowing to eliminate all super-beings who would prevent him from bringing order to the world. The modern day Monarch was foiled by Captain Atom, with both being sent hurtling through time.

John Byrne brought back Omac, a hero active in the near future, in a black & white, prestige format mini-series, **Omac: One Man Army Corps #1-#4** (dated 1991).



Black Canary received her own mini-series, **Black Canary #1-#4** (dated Nov 1991 through Feb 1992), by Sarah E. Byam, Trevor Von Eeden, and Dick Giordano.

**Armageddon: Alien Agenda #1-#4** (dated Nov 1991 through Feb 1992), by Jonathan Peterson and Dan Jurgens, followed the battle between Captain Atom and Monarch through different eras in history. Captain Atom appeared to triumph and returned to his proper time.

After a number of mini-series and specials, Aquaman finally returned to his own ongoing monthly, **Aquaman v4 #1** (dated Dec 1991) by Shaun McLaughlin and Ken Hooper.

**The Brave And The Bold v2 #1-#6** (dated Dec 1991 through June 1992), a mini-series by Mike Grell, Mike Baron, and Shea Anton Pensa, teamed Green Arrow, the Butcher, and the Question.

Robin was given a second mini-series, **Robin II #1-#4** (dated 1991), by Chuck Dixon and Tom Lyle.

The Elongated Man received his own mini-series with **Elongated Man #1-#4** (dated Jan 1992 through Apr 1992), by Gerard Jones and Mike Parobeck.

The Warlord of Skartaris returned in **Warlord v2 #1-#6** (dated Jan 1992 through June 1992), a mini-series by Mike Grell and Dameron Willich.

The son of the original Ray was introduced in **The Ray #1-#6** (dated Feb 1992 through July 1992), a mini-series by Jack C. Harris and Joe Quesada.

Ten silver age classics were reprinted in the **DC Silver Age Classics** series (dated 1992).

**Armageddon: Inferno #1-#4** (dated Apr 1992 through July 1992), a mini-series by John Ostrander and various artists, pitted Waverider and a handful of Earth's heroes against a threat from another dimension. This series freed the Justice Society from their eternal battle in limbo.

The Justice League were featured in a one-shot special, **Justice League Spectacular #1** (dated 1992), by Dan Jurgens.

John Stewart, one of Earth's Green Lanterns, graduated to his own series, **Green Lantern: Mosaic #1** (dated June 1992), by Gerard Jones and Cully Hamner.

A new title was added to the Green Lantern line with **Green Lantern Corps Quarterly #1** (Summer 1992).

The new Black Condor, a character with links to the original, was introduced in **Black Condor #1** (dated June 1992), by Brian Augustyn and Rags Morales.

**Guy Gardner: Reborn #1-#3** (dated 1992), a prestige format mini-series by Gerard Jones and Joe Staton, replaced Guy's Green Lantern ring with one created in the Anti-Matter Universe of Qward.

**Eclipso: The Darkness Within #1** (dated July 1992), the first issue in a two-issue mini-series by Giffen & Fleming with Bart Sears, revealed the true nature of Eclipso. The heroes of the DC Universe battled Eclipso throughout the Summer annuals, converging for a final battle in issue #2.

Arion, the Lord of Atlantis, was revealed to still exist in the present day in **Arion The Immortal #1-#6** (dated July 1992 through Dec 1992), a mini-series by Paul Kupperberg and Ron Wilson.

A fourth Batman title was added to the publication schedule with **Batman: Shadow Of The Bat #1** (dated June 1992), by Alan Grant and Norm Breyfogle.

The second Batman movie was adapted into comic book form in **Batman Returns: The Official Comic Adaptation Of The Warner Bros. Motion Picture** (dated 1992).

**The Hacker Files #1-#12** (dated Aug 1992 through July 1993), a mini-series by Lewis Shiner and Tom Sutton, introduced a computer hack named Jack Marshall into the DCU.

The Justice Society, fully invigorated after their years long battle in limbo, returned in their own ongoing series, **Justice Society Of America v2 #1** (dated Aug 1992) by Len Strazewski and Mike Parobeck.

Charlton's Thunderbolt returned in his own series, **Peter Cannon - Thunderbolt #1** (dated Sep 1992) by Mike Collins.

A new character called the Heckler was introduced in **The Heckler #1** (dated Sep 1992), by Keith Giffen and Tom & Mary Bierbaum.

**Legends Of The Dark Knight** was renamed **Batman: Legends Of The Dark Knight** with issue #37 (dated Sep 1992).

The Team Titans graduated to their own series with **Team Titans #1** (dated Sep 1992) written by Marv Wolfman. There were five versions of the first issue. All contained a common back-up, drawn by Kevin Maguire, with lead features drawn as follows: Killowat by Kerry Gammill, Mirage by Gabriel Morrissette, Nightrider by Mike Netzer, Redwing by Adam Hughes, and Terra by Phil Jimenez.

**Martian Manhunter: American Secrets #1-#3** (dated 1992), a mini-series by Gerard Jones and Eduardo Barreto, revealed a secret conspiracy existing in the United States for decades.

**Batman: Sword Of Azrael #1-#4** (dated Oct 1992 through Jan 1993), a mini-series by Denny O'Neil and Joe Quesada, introduced the legacy of Azrael, warrior of the centuries-old Order of St. Dumas.

**The Darkstars #1** (dated Oct 1992), created by Michael Jan Friedman and Larry Stroman, introduced the Darkstars, intergalactic rivals of the Green Lantern Corps.

**Eclipso: The Darkness Within #2** (dated Oct 1992), by Keith Giffen, Robert Loren Fleming, and Bart Sears, featured the conclusion of the battle with Eclipso. This issue also gave Lar Gand, the teen hero from Daxam, a new name ... Valor. Valor was destined to inspire the creation of the Legion of Super-Heroes in the 30th century.

The adventures of Guy Gardner, the former Green Lantern, continued in **Guy Gardner #1** (dated Oct 1992) by Gerard Jones and Joe Staton.

**Green Lantern: Ganthet's Tale** (dated 1992), a one-shot by Larry Niven and John Byrne, introduced Ganthet, the last of the Guardians of the Universe, and revealed the true secret of Krona and the Guardians.

**Superman: The Man Of Steel #17** (dated Nov 1992), by Louise Simonson and Jon Bogdanove, introduced Doomsday, an unstoppable creature bent on the destruction of the Last Son Of Krypton.

Lar Gand of Daxam, a.k.a. Valor, graduated to his own magazine with **Valor #1** (dated Nov 1992), by Robert Loren Fleming and M.D. Bright.

Congo Bill was betrayed by his former friend, Janu, in **Congorilla #1-#4** (dated Nov 1992 through Feb 1993), a mini-series by Steve Englehart and Neil Vokes.

The threat of Eclipso continued in an ongoing monthly, **Eclipso** #1 (dated Nov 1992) by Giffen, Fleming, and Sears.

Timber Wolf, former member of the Legion of Super-Heroes, was transported back to the twentieth century in **Timber Wolf** #1-#5 (dated Nov 1992 through Mar 1993), a mini-series by Al Gordon and Joe Phillips.

The Spectre returned in another ongoing series, **Spectre v3** #1 (Dec 1992), by John Ostrander and Tom Mandrake.

Robin was featured in a third and final mini-series, **Robin III: Cry Of The Huntress** #1-#6 (dated Dec 1992 through Mar 1993) by Chuck Dixon and Tom Lyle.

The origin of Ra's al Ghul was revealed in the third of three hardcover graphic novels, **Batman: Birth Of The Demon** (dated 1992), by Denny O'Neil and Norm Breyfogle.

## DC Comics, A Retrospective Part Seven: The Polyester Age

And that brings us to the Modern Age of Comics. The Dark Ages. The Polyester Age. By the start of the Polyester Age, greed was already ruining the comics market. Publishers, retailers, and speculators all tried to make a killing in an industry whose primary purpose was to entertain. Enhanced covers, polybagged books, bound-in trading cards, variant covers, and the like pushed the cover price up and up. In addition, many publishers, especially Marvel Comics, glutted the stands with an excessive amount of product. Fans desperately tried to keep their collections complete, but after a while many long term collectors decided the hobby was no longer worth it and quit. Sales dropped drastically, putting many retailers out of business, adding to the problem. One strategy the publishers employed to bring in new readers was to stage “big events”. Unfortunately, many of the changes wrought by these events only served to further drive away the older fans. Rather than review the recent past in depth, we will instead present a handful of examples which highlight the current trend in comics.

Superman was killed by the creature called Doomsday in **Superman v2 #75** (dated Jan 1993), by Dan Jurgens. Four characters appeared in the wake of his death claiming to be the new Man Of Steel. These were the new Superboy, Steel, the Eradicator, and the Cyborg. Superman later returned to life, with the story claiming that this resurrection could never be duplicated. How convenient.

Batman’s back was broken by the villain Bane in **Batman #497** (dated Late July 1993), by Doug Moench and Jim Aparo. Batman chose for his replacement not Nightwing, his former partner, but Azrael, a warrior type who he didn’t completely trust. Luckily for Batman, his back got better and he stopped Azrael before he could do too much damage.

When the Cyborg destroyed Coast City, the former home of Hal Jordan, Earth’s greatest Green Lantern, Jordan went insane. In **Green Lantern v3 #50** (dated Mar 1994), by Ron Frenz and Darryl Banks, Jordan killed or threatened to kill many of his friends and fellow Corps members in an attempt to bring Coast City back to life by altering history. After destroying the Guardians of the Universe and the Green Lantern Corps, he renamed himself Parallax. Parallax then attempted to bring back the Multiverse in **Zero Hour: Crisis In Time #4-#0** (dated Sep 1994), a mini-series by Dan Jurgens. Members of the Justice Society, in existence at DC for over 50 years, were killed off for no good reason other than shock value.

Superman was transformed into an energy being, completely altering his appearance, in **Superman** #123 (dated May 1997), by Dan Jurgens and Ron Frenz. Gone was the familiar red, blue, and yellow costume. It was replaced by an all blue electric look, causing disgruntled fans to dub him “Bluperman”. Months later, a duplicate Superman, this one all red, appeared. This travesty lasted over a year, ending with the merging of the two and the return the traditional hero.

These are but a few examples of the current state of the comic book industry. Hopefully, the new millennium will bring with it a rebirth. We can only wait and see what the future holds for this unique, exciting art form.

A note to the readers regarding the index in section two: (1) I've tried my best to verify as many entries visually as I could, so as not to propagate other's errors, (2) I've marked many of the index's deficiencies with question marks to point out the areas where I can most use help, (3) official titles and publication dates are determined by looking first at the indicia and then second at the cover, (4) titles are listed exactly as stated in the indicia, like when differentiating between "and" and "&", (5) except in a few instances, titles are listed in alphabetical order, generally ignoring "the", "and", "vs.", etc., and (6) any and all comments or corrections would be greatly appreciated.

This fanzine is written in Microsoft Word for Windows (PC) 6.0. Upon request, I will attempt to save the file in other formats such as Word for Macintosh. I am uncertain whether all of the special features will convert properly.
